


# Rocky Mount Train Station And Rocky Mount Bus Depot

## **The Building:**

Rocky Mount Station was originally built in 1893 by the Wilmington and Weldon Railroad. After the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad bought the W&WR, they rebuilt the station between 1911 and 1912, and again in 1916. During the 1960s ACL built a modern structure within the station to store switches and signal equipment before the railroad was merged with the Seaboard Air Line Railroad to form the Seaboard Coast Line Railroad. Between 1997 and 2000 the station was restored to its early 20th Century design features, with additional ADA-compliant platforms and other amenities. The former REA Express freight house is now the home of the Rocky Mount Bus Depot, which serves Greyhound, Trailways, and Tar River Transit buses.

## **Nature of Firm's Responsibilities:**

Landmark Facilities Group was responsible for designing new HVAC, electrical, plumbing, and fire safety systems for both buildings. Features included creating a new atrium entrance for the train station, a restaurant in the bus station, coordination with Amtrak in the train station, and conversion of the upper floors into leasable space.
