Bank of Resolution: Bring your children into the awareness of wrongs they do and to strive to turn wrongs into right. Use an empty container as a Bank of Reconciliation. Explain that each time your child does something hurtful or wrong, he or she should write the act on a slip of paper and put it into the bank. Then when it is time to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the child should re-read the slips to refresh their memory. You may also suggest that the children put a coin in their containers for each offense and give the money to help the poor, as Jesus would.

Did you Know?

A key or a pair of keys, usually crisscrossed in the shape of an "X", is the most common symbol for the sacrament of Reconciliation and came from Jesus' words to Peter, "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven", by which Jesus imparted his authority to the Church. "Whatever you find on earth shall be found in heaven, and whatever you lose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." (Matthew 16:19), by which he established the Sacrament of Reconciliation and gave the Church the authority to forgive sins.
