Family Service Project

Start a new Catholic tradition of visiting seven churches on Holy Thursday after mass. The Seven Churches Visitation is a tradition that grew out of the time of prayer and Adoration at the closing of Holy Thursday Mass. Catholics remember when Jesus asked his disciples to stay and watch with Him while they were in the garden. This tradition of mindful watching is a sort of pilgrimage to various altars of repose, in different churches that correspond to each of the seven places, or “stations,” that were made by Jesus between the Last Supper in the Upper Room to His crucifixion on the cross. Decide as a family who you will lift in prayer at each church you visit.

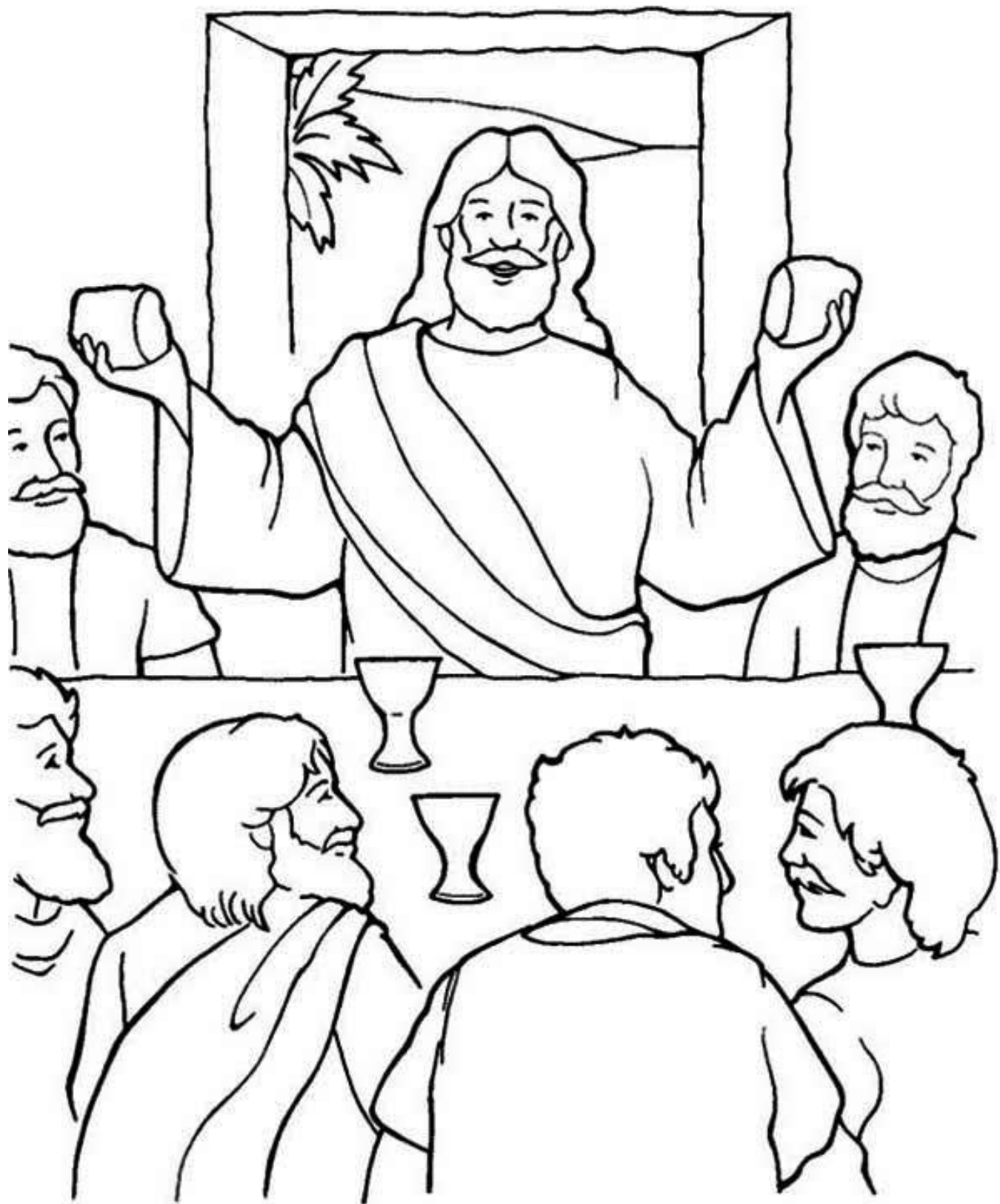
Did you know?

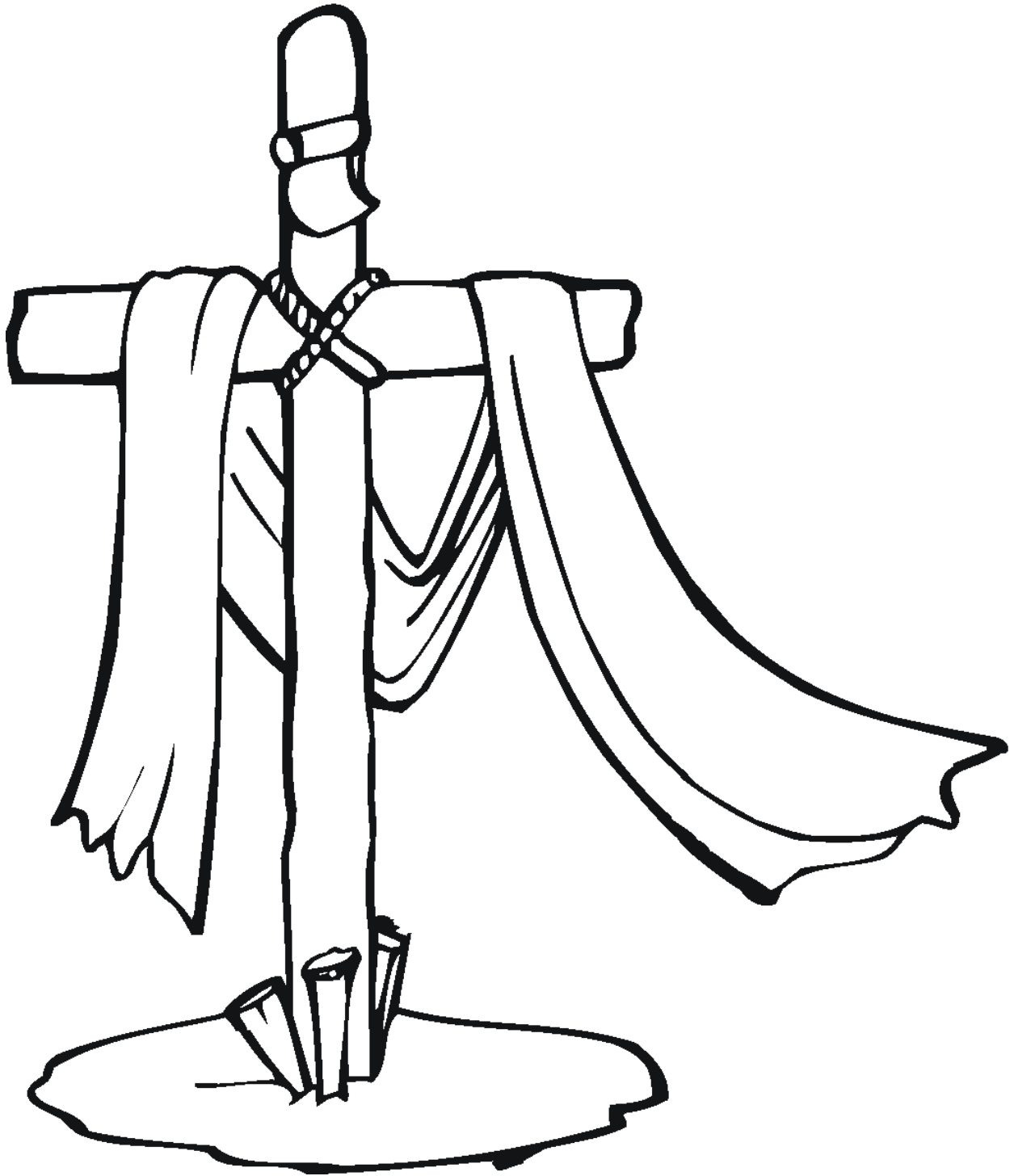
Did you know that Holy Week is the last week of Lent. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday and ends with the Triduum. The Easter Triduum begins at sundown on Holy Thursday with the Mass of the Lord’s Supper, continues with Good Friday and concludes with Easter evening prayer at sundown on Easter Sunday: its high point is the celebration of the Easter Vigil.
