



Fr. Don's Musings . . .

This weekend we honor our patroness, St. Clare of Assisi. She lived about 800 years ago in Assisi, Italy and she was the first woman to join St. Francis' troupe of disciples. She spent all of her adult life leading the Poor Clares, the women's division of Francis' followers. Clare was a strong and committed woman. She was very prayerful and lived super simply in order to devote all her attention to God and serving God's people. I'm honored to be serving here at St. Clare Church, a church dedicated to such a strong and devout woman.

This weekend we dedicate our new Mary's Garden. The garden is located behind the parish office building. If you haven't walked through it yet, please walk over there and enjoy the peaceful garden. The garden project was headed up by Maria Clemente and funded by many people's specific donations, but especially by Craig and Vicky Kelly. The Kellys are long time parishioners who are dedicated to the good of St. Clare Church. I appreciate their generosity. Silvino Pacheco (parishioner and landscaper) used his expertise to install the garden. We'll dedicate the garden at 10am this Sunday.

This week on Thursday, we have our mini-pilgrimage to The Grotto. Many parishioners have signed up for the prayerful event. We'll start with Mass here at St. Clare at 8:30am, then we'll carpool over to The Grotto, have a tour by Pia de Leon, time for quiet reflection while wandering the gardens and chapels, and pray the rosary together. "This and That" from Deacon Bill . . . St. Clare of Assisi

This weekend our Parish honors our own personal patron saint, St. Clare of Assisi. She was born to a wealthy family in Assisi in 1194 when St. Francis was 13 years old. Francis in his early twenties experienced a voice from God that directed him to live for God alone and take "Lady Poverty" as his bride. In 1209, Francis began his itinerant ministry and had other men follow him. Clare had witnessed the journey of Francis and decided to follow his way of life. On Palm Sunday 1212, she met Francis and his brothers at a chapel and committed herself to live the



Gospel in poverty and chastity. Eventually, Francis invited Clare to lead a community of women and provided a small house for them near the church of San Damiano. They wore rough habits, went barefoot, fasted, slept on the floor, abstained from meat, and spoke only when necessary.

Later Clare befriended Queen Agnes of Bohemia who also became a saint. Four letters which Clare wrote to Agnes between 1234 and 1253 have been preserved. They provide a look into the spirituality of St. Clare. In one portion of the 4th Letter composed in the same year as her death, Clare asks the Queen to look at herself in Christ the Mirror...

Happy the soul to whom it is given to attain this life with Christ, to cleave with all one's heart to Him whose beauty all the heavenly hosts behold forever; whose love inflames our love; whose contemplation is our refreshment; whose graciousness is our delight; whose gentleness fills us to overflowing; whose remembrance gives sweet light; whose fragrance revives the dead; whose glorious vision will be the happiness of all citizens of that heavenly Jerusalem. For he is the brightness of eternal glory, the splendor of eternal light, the mirror without spot. Look into that mirror daily. O queen and spouse of Jesus. Always study your face in it, so that within and without you may adorn and clothe and gird yourself with all manner of virtue. So by God's grace you can contemplate blessed poverty, holy humility, and sacred charity, which are reflected in that mirror.

St. Agnes of Bohemia (Prague) opted for a life of charity, mortification of the flesh and piety over a life of luxury and comfort. She founded and lived in a convent in Prague which was a double monastery for Franciscan friars and Poor Clare nuns. It appears she was formed by her relationship with St. Clare and performed many miracles in her life dying in 1282.

St. Clare was said to have the gift of healing, but she herself was ill for about 27 years before she died in 1253 at the age of 59. (Francis died in 1226 at the age of 45 with the stigmata which he received on Sept. 17, 1224.) St. Clare had a large following of women known as the Poor Clares with convents located in Italy and France. She died in 1253, the day after the Rule of St. Clare for her order was approved by Pope Innocent IV. Her last words were reported to be, "Blessed be You, O God, for having created me."

St. Clare pray for us!
