"This and That" from Deacon Bill . . . Feast of the Assumption

This past Friday we celebrated the Feast of the Assumption Here are some thoughts from a sermon by St. Germanus of Constantinople (634-732) who was one of the saints who helped form the Catholic doctrines of Mary (Immaculate Conception and Assumption).

"When Christ willed that his Mother, who had borne Life Itself within her, should be taken upwards to himself, he told her through an angel who was already known to her, that the time of her falling asleep was now at hand. And this he did, so that through the intimation of her coming death, she might not be troubled at her departure from the living. For we know that the separation of the body can bring distress of even strong men and women. Therefore, he who knows all things sent an angel to her, to give her strength to the soul by such words as these, coming from Christ himself through him:

It is time for me to take to myself, you, my Mother. As you have filled the earth with joy, so you shall you bring joy to heaven. You will gladden the mansions of my Father and delight the spirits of the saints. For beholding the honor of the angels give to you at your translation to me, they shall be confirmed in their belief that through you their members also shall dwell in my light, oh full of Grace!

Come, therefore with exceeding great joy! Hail and again rejoice as once before. For you above all creatures are worthy of being hailed – full of grace! As when you were about to conceive me, you received tidings of great joy, so now rejoice that once more you are sought for, so be received by me." *

It took many years to declare the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception as dogma which took place and was declared by Pope Pius IX in his papal bull, *Ineffabilis Deus*, on December 8, 1854. It took many more years for the doctrine of the Assumption of Mary to be declared infallible which took place on November 1, 1950, when Pope Pius XII proclaimed it as dogma through the Apostolic Constitution *Munificentissimus Deus*.

It should be noted that papal infallibility was officially defined by Pope Pius IX in 1870 after the dogma of the Immaculate Conception and has only been used in the history of the Church these two times and only regarding the Blessed Virgin Mary, Our Mother.

Today the Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us "The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Vigin Mary celebrates the Blessed Mother's entrance into heavenly glory. Mary's Assumption into heaven reminds us that life on earth is a pilgrimage to our ultimate destination. We prepare in hope for our own passage to eternal life by the choices we make today. When we choose to love and follow God in our daily lives, we strengthen our relationship with Him, and this relationship in the true meaning of heaven: To live in heaven is 'to be with Christ.' " (CCC, 1025)


Food Pantry Needs
