



#### "This and That" from Deacon Bill... Reflection on Today's Gospel: Luke 13:22-30

Today's Gospel might make us squirm in our seats.

We meet Jesus on his way to Jerusalem. Passing through the various towns and villages on his route, he stops and teaches those who have come out to hear him. Someone along the way asks him, "Lord, will only a few people be saved? Jesus rarely answers a question directly. He doesn't this time either. He turns the question back on the questioner. He says, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough."

What does he mean by "enter through the narrow gate"? Does he mean that the number of people who will get into heaven is limited? It sure seems that's what Jesus means when he says that the gate is narrow, but we do know that anything worth having in this world requires work. We want a strong body, we work for it. We want a strong marriage, we work at it. We want a strong company, we work for it. Why should it be any different in our faith?

Maybe the person who asked that question of Jesus was thinking about a friend, a neighbor, a family member – someone who was lacking in their faith and love of God.

The idea that seems to be widespread with a lot of people in the Catholic Church today is that the Christian life is easy and that requires only a minimal output of effort. What an absurd idea! I heard it said, "90% percent of our parishes across the country require less commitment than the local Rotary club." This is disturbing, yet who could deny it is true?

The narrow gate suggests that Christ loves us whoever we may be and whatever we have done, but Christ expects that we will not stay where we are. We need to grow. Christ expects us to strive mightily to live according to the standard he has established for us. Simply put, "Love God and love your neighbor. Life is a journey - we can't just say I know all my prayers and I come to Mass every Sunday. The psalm today says it all, "Go out to all the world and tell the good news." Jesus demands more from us! His message should motivate us to leave our comfort zone and help others enter that narrow gate.

Our best selling point is not necessarily our words but our behavior and our actions. I'm sure we are all doing this, but maybe it's time for us to use our words and ask those we are concerned about and those we meet, a simple question that was popular a few years back and still applies today: *If* you were put on trial for being a Christian, could enough evidence be presented to convict you?

Jesus saying the gate is narrow and asking people to know Him requires work. We who are here at Mass every week or even reading this should be the people who help others. Our faith asks us to invite our neighbors who are missing from Mass and church to come back.

God loves all of us whoever we are, but the narrow gate suggests that we should not stay where we are. We are called to be God's helpers. Christ calls us to a new way of living - a life of loving God and loving our neighbor with prayer and with action.

We are all are on a journey. All journeys are meant to bring us to a destination. The only true destination is heaven and our focus should be helping those who have strayed to return. Our true challenge as active Catholics is the salvation of souls which requires us to know Jesus Christ who leads us to heaven by continually feeding us with his body and blood.
