

Fr. Don's Musings . . .

This week, we celebrated the Feast of the Immaculate Conception recognizing Mary being born free from original sin so that she could be the perfectly pure woman to birth the Christ child. Besides being born free from sin, she lived her life without sinning. Mary is a perfect example for us to strive to live our lives free from sin.

As I said during the Immaculate Conception Masses, if we were baptized as babies, our baptism washed away original sin, and in a sense we "caught up" to Mary at that point. But then as we grew older, we gave into our weaknesses and chose to sin, so then we were different from Mary. But when we go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we are washed free from sin, so once again we "catch up" to Mary.

During this season of Advent, I will be available for confessions (Sacrament of Reconciliation) after all the weekend Masses. We will also have our Advent Reconciliation Service this Friday, Dec. 15 at 7pm. Two other priests will join me. We will have a brief prayer service followed by individual confessions. I strongly encourage you to take advantage of confession during this Advent season of preparation for Christmas. Baptism and Reconciliation allow us to "catch up" to Mary in being free from sin. Do it!

Signs of the Times by Deacon Bill . . . The Eucharist in the Catechism

As we continue through our Advent Season this year, the Archdiocese has asked us to focus is on the Eucharist since we are in the middle of the year of Eucharistic Revival. This revival asks us - no matter where we are on our journey of faith - to grow in love for the Eucharist and to make it the source and summit of our lives.



Not many of us embrace the Catechism since it is a rather large book. However, it is a tool to enlighten us with the true teaching of the Catholic Church that has been handed on to us through scripture and tradition. Chapter two, entitled *The Celebration of the Christian Mystery*, introduces us to the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church. It defines a sacrament as "an efficacious sign of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us." (CCC 1131)

As we delve into what stands out in the section on the Eucharist, St Thomas Aquinas wrote that *we can love only what we know*. The Archdiocese has given us the following sections of the Catechism in order to deepen our understanding of the Eucharist, so we can come to love and embrace Jesus more deeply in His Real Presence:

(CCC 1324) The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all the ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. (OP5) For in the Blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch." (Pasch in the early church referred to the Pascal Mystery of Jesus – the Passion, Death, and Resurrection.)

The following paragraphs sum up how Jesus is truly present in the Holy Eucharist, the Real Presence of Jesus in BODY, BLOOD, SOUL, and DIVINTY.

(CCC 1406) Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; ... he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and ... abides in me, and I in him" (John 6:51, 54)

(CCC 1407) The Eucharist is the heart and summit of the Church's life, for in it Christ associates his Church and all her members with the sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving offered once and for all on the cross to his Father; by this sacrifice he pours out the grace of salvation on his Body the Church.

(CCC 1408) The Eucharist celebration always includes: the proclamation of the Word of God; thanks-giving to God the Father for all his benefits, above all the gift of the Son; the consecration of the bread and wine; and participation in the liturgical banquet by receiving the Lord's body and blood. These elements constitute one single act of worship.

(CCC 1409) The Eucharist is the memorial of Christ's Passover, that is, of the work of salvation accomplished by the life, death, and resurrection of Christ, a work made present by liturgical action.

(CCC 1410) It is Christ himself, Eternal high priest of the New Covenant, who acting through the ministry of the priests, offers the Eucharistic sacrifice. And it is the same Christ, really present under the species of bread and wine, who is offering of the Eucharistic sacrifice.




