"This and That "from Deacon Bill . . . 4th Sunday of Advent

The gospel readings for the 4th Sunday of Advent prepare us for Christmas since they are taken from the infancy narratives of St. Luke and St. Matthew. In St. Mark's Gospel, we hear about John the Baptist and then skip all the way to the Baptism of the Lord, as a result nothing is heard about Jesus' early years. The last two years, the Annunciation and Visitation of Mary have been included, and rightfully so, since she was the most important person in God's plan to come into our world as one of us. However, this year St. Matthew's account of the birth of Jesus through the eyes of St. Joseph will be read.



St. Joseph is an extremely important individual in the birth and early years of Jesus, being his earthly father and head of the Holy Family whose feast we will celebrate the weekend after Christmas.

The Gospels tell us very little about Joseph except that he is a dreamer and a man of action. Not one word from his mouth appears in any Gospel. In the lineage presented by Matthew, he is an ancient relative of King David. This is so important because the ancient prophets foretold that the Messiah would come from the line of David.


There are very few verses in Matthew and Luke that provide enough information to show us why he was the divine choice to become the husband of Mary and the earthly father of Jesus. Joseph was genealogical perfect as a distant descendant of King David and from Bethlehem, the city from where the scriptures predicted the Messiah would come. But you, Bethlehem-Ephrathah, too small to be among the clans of Judah . . . (Mic 5:1). Is he not the carpenter's son? (Mt 13:55) Joseph was poor which would have been a preference of Christ. Matthew also tells us that God communicated with Joseph by dreams: to take Mary as his spouse (Mt 1:20), to take the Holy Family to Egypt (Mt 2:13), the return to Israel (Mt 2:20), and to change his plans and head to Nazareth in the region of Galilee (Mt 2:22). All those dreams fulfilled Old Testament prophesies: virgin birth in Isaiah, to relive the Exodus experience, and so Jesus could be called a Nazorean. There is no mention of Joseph's death anywhere, but there was a stained-glass window in the church I ministered at in NY depicting Joseph dying a peaceful death with Jesus and Mary present depicting how Joseph most likely died.

From a homily by St. Bernardine of Siena: "What then is Joseph's position in the Church? Is he not a man chosen and set apart? Through him and, yes, under him Christ was fittingly and honorably introduced into the world. The Holy Church in its entirety is indebted to the Virgin Mother because through her it was judged worthy to receive Christ. But after her we owe special gratitude and reference to Saint Joseph."

St. Joseph is the patron saint of fathers, the Church, workers, China and Peru. His feast days are March 19 and May 1.

St. Joseph, pray for us.


