

This weekend is the beginning of Catholic Schools Week. Our Catholic schools are one of many neat things about our Catholic Church.

Here are some numbers on Catholic schools in our diocese:

Number of schools: 51 Number of students: 15,235 Number of staff: 141

Our school here at St. Clare is as old as the parish, 110 years. Currently, we have 230 students in the K-8 school and 75 in the preschool/davcare. Our preschool/ daycare has five classrooms ranging from infants to PreK. Our K-8 school has one class for each grade plus Art, P.E., Music, Library, Drama and Spanish. Of course, our Catholic faith is incorporated into all the classes. Our teachers promote strong Christian values and our behavior expectations are very high. I personally visit every homeroom classroom every day and I'm proud of the way our teachers teach and our students learn. Mr. Chris Harris is our school principal and Mrs. Nancy Melzer is our preschool Director, both of them are exceptional leaders. Thank you to all the parents who sacrifice to send their children to our school. We have lots of strong and loving families in our school community.

I'm real proud of our St. Clare School and Preschool. Please come over and visit the school at our Open House this Sunday from 12-2pm. You can tour the school, meet the teachers and see what a great school we have here at St. Clare.

On a whole different topic: I'm leaving on vacation Monday. I'll be in Hawaii with college friends for nine days. I haven't had a nine day vacation since pre-Covid days. I'm looking forward to it! Frs. Jim Galluzzo and Pat McNamee have graciously offered to help out while I am away, and the church staff is here to answer any of your questions.

#### Signs of the Times by Deacon Bill . . . The Bible

I hope this bulletin finds everyone back to a somewhat normal life after our week of extremely harsh weather. Talking with Fr. Don, I related to him that after living all of my 68 years (except the 4 years in the military) in NY; I have never experienced a week of weather like what we just underwent. I have dealt numerous times with snow falls up to two feet requiring lots of shoveling, but no major ice, power outages, or falling trees. During this housebound time, I was discerning what to write about in this humble column for the bulletin every week. Last year if you recall, I focused on the saints appearing on the Church's calendar. What has been coming at me (I hope from the Holy Spirit) is to take on the books of the Bible.

Now for the record, I am no Bible scholar and do not claim to be one. I attended 12 years of Catholic schooling in Brooklyn, NY including grade school at St. Brendan's with the Sisters of St. Joseph and Xaverian High School which at the time was boys only taught by the Xaverian brothers. My junior year religion class was the only time that we focused on the New Testament of the Bible. In those days before Vatican II, a great council of the Church from 1962 -1965 which opened the laity to better participation in the Church, no one was encouraged to read the bible except the clergy and theologians. I'm sure a lot of you remember those days. In formation for the Deaconate, we had a course on the Old Testament and a few courses on the New Testament. At my parish, Sacred Heart of Jesus in Bayside, my wife, Alice, and I led many Bible study sessions using the Little Rock Bible Series. I have been actively reading the Liturgy of the Hours, the daily prayer of the Church, since I was ordained a Deacon in 2007. So you can see from by my credentials that I personally still have a lot to learn about the Bible.

There are two great bible study applications available online, *Hallow* and *The Ascension App*, which offer a podcast called, *the Bible in a Year*, by Fr. Mike Schmitz. These apps also include numerous podcasts which Fr. Mike started in 2021. Each podcast is also available on *You Tube* and runs for about 20-30 minutes. I know within your hectic lives you may not have the time to take on all of the 365 plus episodes. I am hoping to view some of them along with the introduction to each of the 73 individual books of the Bible. Then God willing with the help of the Holy Spirit, I will put together a 4-5 minute read in the bulletin every week. Some books will require less summary and others more, but I hope this endeavor will be completed within the 48 remaining weeks in this year.

Again this is not an intense look at the bible, but just a quick overview. I hope you will join me in this adventure and pray that the Holy Spirit guides me in words that will enlighten and inspire you to appreciate God's salvation story presented in these great books.


