



“This and That “from Deacon Bill . . . St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274)

This Wednesday is the feast day of St. Thomas Aquinas, a Doctor of the Church. His greatest work, *Summa Theologica*, was never finished. At a Mass in 1273 he said, “All I have written seems to me like straw compared to what I have seen and has been revealed to me.” His writings encompassed both theology and philosophy. Some of his thoughts on *the cross exemplifying every virtue* from a conference at which he spoke are following:

Why did the son of Man have to suffer for us? There is a great need, and it could be considered in a twofold way: in the first place, as a remedy for sin, and secondly, as an example of how to act. It is a remedy, for in the face of all the evils which we incur on account of our sins, we have found relief through the passion of Christ. Yet, it is no less an example, as the passion of Christ completely suffices to fashion our lives. Whoever wishes to live perfectly should do nothing but to disdain what Christ distained on the cross and desire what he desired, for the cross exemplifies every virtue.



If you seek the example of love: *Greater love than this no man has, than to lay down his life for his friends.* Such a man was Christ on the cross. And if he gave his life for us, then it should not be difficult to bear whatever hardships arise for his sake.

If you seek patience, you will find no better example than the cross. Great patience occurs in two ways: either when one patiently suffers much, or when one suffers things which one is able to avoid and yet does not avoid. Christ endured much on the cross, and did so patiently because when he suffered he did not threaten; he was led like a sheep to the slaughter and he did not open his mouth. Therefore Christ’s patience on the cross was great. In patience let us run for the prize set before us, looking upon Jesus, the author and perfector of our faith who, for the joy set before him, bore his cross and despised the shame.

If you seek an example of his humility, look upon the crucified one, for God has wished to be judged by Pontius Pilate and to die.

If you seek an example of obedience, follow him who became obedient to the Father even unto death. For just as the disobedience of one man, namely, Adam, many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one man, many were made righteous.

If you seek an example of despising earthly things, follow him who is the King of kings and Lord of lords, in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. Upon the cross he was stripped, mocked, spat upon, struck, crowned with thorns, and given only vinegar and gall to drink. Do not be attached, therefore, to clothing and riches, because they divided my garments among themselves. Nor to honors, for he experienced harsh words and scourging. Nor to greatness of rank, for wearing a crown of thorns they placed on his head. Nor anything delightful, for in my thirst they gave him vinegar to drink.

St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.

All men of the parish are invited to participate in *Brothers in Spirit*, a new men's faith formation group devoted to spiritual growth, prayer, and fraternity.



Get to Know Your Fellow St. Clare Parishioners

A bulletin series designed to build community by learning about our members

In the second article in this series, we feature a family that truly reflects the values, faith and energy of St. Clare. Jason and Allison Beam happen to attend the 10:45 Mass as do my wife Judy and I. When they come to Mass it is like someone just placed a magnet in the pew. People come from everywhere to chat and greet them. They are ebullient, always smiling, and more often than not, engaged in a ministry at the Mass. They reflect the joy of the gospel message in a bigger than life way, which no doubt inspires many. Let's get to know them a little better.

The Beams have been members of our parish since 2005 when they moved to Portland from Seattle. They bought a house two blocks from the church, moved in, then took a walk and found our Parish! Interestingly, Jason was not Catholic at the time, but landing at St. Clare provided a comfortable place to continue his faith journey which resulted in his conversion in 2013. It seems like God's plan for Jason is to be involved our church...good stuff! The desire to have their children get the same Christian education they enjoyed resulted in 3 of their children attending St. Clare School from preschool through 8th grade and the youngest is now there in 4th grade. Their oldest son has just started college. Their kids who have graduated talk of the education and foundation of faith formed at our school and how it continues to drive the decisions in their lives today. Jason noted also that being part of the church has contributed to their "extremely strong" marriage.

The kids, Brady, Berkley, Carson, and Camden are all Altar Servers, Ushers, and if confirmed, Eucharistic Ministers. They were readers at school masses and have continued that into high school. Allison and Jason serve in multiple ministries as well. Jason loves being in the bullpen, so to speak, ready to fill in for ushering or any other need. St. Clare is truly a family affair for the Beams. One key thing I note: when any of the family members are serving at Mass, they are enthusiastic and obviously very happy to be there. It is real, and it can't help but draw you into the celebration.

The family enjoys being active together and outside of church, you might find them on a golf course, walking their dog, or volunteering. Allison in particular helped start a group called St. Clare Circle of Moms. The idea was to connect young moms to support each other. They have sponsored Lenten soup suppers, done fund raisers, and social gatherings geared toward service of the church. Allison has also been involved in school auctions, has been both a first communion and confirmation leader and has engaged confirmation candidates in service to the St. Vincent de Paul Society, especially around Christmas. Jason is in the commercial flooring business has worked with our facilities personnel to provide products like the carpet in the church and materials for the office when it recently flooded. In addition, he has served on the school advisory council.


I was taken aback hearing all the ways the Beams have been involved at St. Clare. I asked how all of this service has affected the family. Allison replied "when the family is engaged in the Mass and other services, we feel we have a greater tie to our church and our faith because we are actively involved". Jason said that being part of the collective community has also been very important. He really appreciates the church family.

In learning about all the Beam family, I was reminded of a quote from the bible. James 2:17-19 says "So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. But someone will say, 'You have faith and I have works.' Show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith". The Beams personify showing faith by their works, and I for one, can learn from their example.
