

Alleluia, He is risen! Happy Easter everyone.

Jesus' resurrection is our promise of new life. He was clearly dead and buried on that tragic Friday in Jerusalem, but 3 days later he was alive and well. We celebrate his new life, and it reminds us that he wants us to experience new life as well.

At the end of our lives Jesus wants to raise us up to Heaven for all eternity. Signs of the Times by Deacon Bill . . . He is Risen! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Here we are on Easter Sunday.

We have traveled through another Lent. (I hope it was fruitful and you were inspired to commit to some new ways of prayer as presented by Fr. Don, other motivating devotions or new habits to continue to help you encounter your relationship with our God.)



We have walked with Jesus through Holy Week.

On **Palm Sunday** we received our palms and recalled how Jesus made a glorious entrance into Jerusalem for the Passover Feast.

But soon enough **Spy Wednesday** arrived with the retelling of the story of Judas making a deal to point out Jesus to the Pharisees, so they could arrest him for 30 pieces of silver. (We were all reminded of the many times we have let Jesus down by our words and actions.)

Holy Thursday joined us with Jesus, his apostles, and his followers to celebrate a Passover meal. This meal was celebrated by our sisters and brothers of the Jewish faith for over 5 centuries before Jesus was born. But here at our meal something special happens! Jesus turned this event into something great by giving us the best gift ever received. It is better that all the Christmas, birthday, graduation, wedding, and anniversary gifts combined. It is simply a gift of himself. What more can we as present-day Catholics want?! He doesn't give us a WHAT, a host or a drink of wine. NO, NO, NO. Every time we receive that host and/or wine changed by the power of God, Jesus gives us his own Body and Blood, a WHO, Jesus in his entirety - body, blood, soul, and divinity. He told his apostles, "Do this in remembrance of me." (Lk 22: 19b) Jesus also taught us by the example of washing feet to serve instead of to be served. "I have given you a model to follow so as I have done for you, you should also do." (Jn 13:15)

On **Good Friday** there was no Mass. This day can only be called good, because Jesus had to die in order to rise from the dead. What a cruel death he suffered for all of us as portrayed in the Stations of the Cross and reading of the Passion. We recall Jesus' suffering and death every time we gather to celebrate Mass when we offer again Jesus' perfect sacrifice of the cross back to God.

Easter Sunday is the zenith of the Catholic year, our faith would not be anything without the Resurrection.

Prayer for Easter from the Liturgy of the Hours:

God our Father, creator of all, today is a day of Easter joy. This is the morning on which the Lord appeared to men who had begun to lose hope and opened their eyes to what scripture foretold: that first he would die, and then he would rise and ascend into his Father's glorious presence. May the risen Lord breathe on our minds and open our eyes that we may know him in the breaking of the bread, and follow him in his risen life. Grant this through Christ our Lord. Amen.




