

Get to Know Your Fellow St. Clare Parishioners

When it comes to being long time members of our parish, Tim and Julie Zweber are true veterans as they joined St. Clare way back in 1992. There were churches closer to where they originally lived, but after a bit of "church shopping" the couple was drawn by how welcoming our parish was and how it served the community. The Zwebers have thoroughly embraced the service ethic by being engaged with St. Vincent de Paul, the hospitality ministry at St. Andre Bessette, and Rebuilding Together.

All 4 of their children graduated from St. Clare School and Julie was an aide in Kindergarten for 17 years until June 2019. There was a waiting list when they wanted to enroll their son Zach, the first one to attend, and when the opportunity arose they jumped on it because after going

to an open house they found the school just as welcoming as the parish, and felt it would be a great fit for their children. They were proven right and the children had a great education and experience at school. All the kids are grown now and live in town. They have six grandkids and are blessed to see them often.

The couple celebrated their 40th wedding anniversary on March 9th. The Zwebers live two blocks away from the church and when visiting their home, one is greeted by beautiful gardens of flowers, especially dahlias. Being both retired has afforded Tim and Julie the opportunity to travel, and they love doing it, especially being road warriors in their travel trailer. One goal they have is to visit all of the National Parks. They've visited 40 so far and drove Route 66 in September from Santa Monica to Chicago with the trailer in tow.

Tim and Julie usually attend the 5:00 pm Saturday Mass. When I asked Tim about what continues to draw him to the Catholic faith he instantly replied "The Eucharist; the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist is so unique to our faith it is overwhelming to me sometimes." I could see a deep reverence and emotion in Tim's eyes when he said this. As Father Don would say....good stuff! Since I am on the Pastoral Council and part of our job is to ask parishioners about how we can improve our faith experience, I posed the question. Julie was quick to respond with a suggestion. "I would like to see us return to holding hands during the Our Father prayer and shake hands during the offering of the Sign of Peace. I feel it is a special sharing experience that we should bring back. We certainly could at least offer our hands to those around us who want to do the same. Well noted, Julie!

The Zwebers love talking to church members and do try to make an effort to engage those around them at Mass. When asked what we might do to make new parishioners feel as welcome as possible, Tim and Julie came up with a great idea. "Of course Father Don always encourages us to come to coffee and donuts after Mass. That is a great opportunity to build community and meet new people, but most of us are drawn to those we know and tend to gather around them. I know I can do a better job of reaching outside of my circle", Tim said. Julie then jumped in with "Maybe Fr. Don should give us one of his famous homework assignments, to find someone you have not met or who looks like they could use a friend. Then go and introduce yourself and try to meet a new person every week". I thought it was a great idea and a reminder that building community means everyone needs to grab a brick and jump in on the construction, so to speak.

There is something about seeing Tim and Julie Zweber at Mass that makes me feel good about being part of St. Clare. They embody the faith in that they are consistent, steady and committed. Their smile alone says a lot about them. I have jokingly said for some time that I wanted to be like Tim and Julie when I grow up, but it is really true. Thank you both for helping to not only sustain our church and community, but build it up too.

"This and That" from Deacon Bill... Women Doctors of the Church

Looking back on October, there were two great saints who had feast days which I seemed to have overlooked - St. Therese of Lisieux, and St. Teresa of Avila. Both of these women were declared Doctors of the Church. This is a title given to saints recognized as having made a significant contribution to theology or doctrine through their research, study or writings. The Church has bestowed this title on 38 saints - 4 women who I would like to focus on today.

- **St. Hildegard of Bingen (1098-1179, Feast day is Sept. 13).** She is known for her visionary experiences, extensive musical works, writings on natural history and medicine, and her role as a respected advisor to emperors and popes. With the help of a monk named, Volmar, she recorded a book of 26 revelations called *the Scivias or Know God's Way*. Here is a famous quote from St. Hildegard: "The path is not long, but the way is deep. You must not only walk there, you must be prepared to leap. I am the fiery life of the essence of God; I am the flame above the beauty in the fields; I shine in the waters; I burn in the sun, the moon and the stars."
- **St. Catherine of Siena (1347-1380, Feast day is Apr. 29).** She is famous for her holiness, mystical visions and spirituality, and celebrated for her devotion, wisdom, and writings. Her greatest work is called, *The Dialogue*. Pope Gregory XI was influenced by Catherine to return to his papacy, which eventually lasted 70 years, from Avignon, France to Rome in 1377. These are some of her notable words, "God: I have placed you in the midst of your fellows that you may do to them what you cannot do to me, that is to say that you love your neighbor freely without expecting any return from him, and what you do to him I count as done to me."
- **St Teresa of Avila (1515 1582, Feast Day is Oct. 15).** Teresa was a mystic and author of spiritual writings and poems. Prayer that displaces charity, she said, does not please God. Her own care for others was proof of her spirituality. As an activist who helped thousands live their daily lives in a more Christ-like way, she wrote many practical books on prayer. Her most well-known work was *The Interior Castle*. Teresa also founded 17 renewed Carmelite convents in Spain and spearheaded a general renewal of Catholic life during and after the Protestant Reformation. Some of her thoughts follow, "What the Lord desires is works. If you see a sick woman to whom you can give some help, never be affected by the fear that your devotions will suffer but take pity on her: if she is in pain, you should feel pain too: if necessary fast so that she may have your food, not so much for her sake as because you know it is God's will. That is true union with his will."
- **St. Therese of Lisieux (1873-1897, Feast Day is Oct. 1).** She is remembered for her *Little Way* spirituality, a practical approach to holiness that involves doing ordinary things with great love and confidence in God's mercy. In *A Story of a Soul*, her autobiography, describes it as a release from depression and oversensitivity. Here is a famous quote from St. Therese, "*Miss no single opportunity of making some small sacrifice, here by a smiling look, there by a kind word; always doing the smallest right and doing it all for love. It is true that Love knows no such word as impossible, for it deems all things possible, all things allowed." She died at the early age of 24 and is the patron saint of Foreign Missions, France and Outreach to Russia.*
