

"This and That" from Deacon Bill...

This week our Jewish brothers and sisters celebrate a special holy week that starts at sundown on Monday with a two-day feast called Rosh Hashanah and ends on Thursday, Oct. 2 with the celebration of Yom Kippur. Our heritage as Catholics comes to us from the people of Israel portrayed in the Old Testament readings which we hear proclaimed every Sunday. We also hear the story of creation leading us to God's plan when he sent the Archangel Gabriel to a teenage virgin in a remote village in Bethlehem Keep in mind that the most important feast that the Jewish people celebrate is the Passover meal which recalls their freedom from bondage in Egypt. For Catholics, the Passover feast is our most important feast also when we celebrate Jesus giving us the gift of his Body and Blood on Holy Thursday and saying to his apostles, "... Do this in memory of me." (Lk 22:19)

So what is this Jewish 10-day celebration of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kipper all about?

Rosh Hashanah can be traced back to 6th century B.C. It was never mentioned in the Torah (the Jewish Old Testament writings) but was first found in the Mishna (the first major written collection of oral laws) in 200 B.C. However, its roots come from Leviticus 23; 23-24, "The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the Israelites: On the first day of the seventh month you shall keep a Sabbath rest with a sacred assembly and with the trumpet blasts as a reminder." The holiday celebrates the Jewish New Year with the start of the Hebrew month of Tishrei, the agricultural new year. It was transformed from the time of Babylon captivity which celebrated the anniversary of the creation of the world and the day of judgement. The Jewish calendar was fixed around 360 B.C. by three Jewish leaders who calculated year 3761 B.C. as the date the world was created. If we add 2025 from the Roman calendar, then 5786 is the year the Jewish people are celebrating. The celebration starts Monday at sundown and focuses on special synagogue services with readings from Abraham and the hearing of the shofar (ram's horn) being blown. (Ex 19:26 and Jos 6:20) It is a time for personal reflection, asking for forgiveness, and a spiritual wake-up call to begin the new year with good intentions. Festive foods (apples and honey to wish for a sweet new year and new fruit that is blooming) and charitable giving are part of the celebration. On the first day, people go to a body of water and toss breadcrumbs into it, symbolizing the casting away sins from the previous year.

On **Yom Kipper**, the holiest day of the year, Jews fast for 25 hours, refrain from work and physical pleasures (like bathing and kissing your spouse) and attend five special synagogue services for confessions and reading from the Book of Jonah. The day is a solemn time for repentance, prayer (including the deceased), introspection, and seeking forgiveness from God for past mistakes, and concluding with a single, long blast from the shofar. Many celebrate by wearing white to signify purity as they begin to enter the new year.

To our Jewish sisters and brothers, we wish you a blessed and meaningful holy week.
