



Fr. Don's Musings . . .

On Monday, morning 35 parishioners and friends will be leaving on our St. Clare Pilgrimage to Italy. We'll spend ten days traveling, touring holy sites and connecting with God in a special way. Please keep our pilgrims in your prayers and know that the pilgrims will be praying for the parish each day of the pilgrimage. Here are some of the highlights of the trip:

Tuesday through Friday, we'll be in Rome attending an audience with Pope Leo on Wednesday, and visiting the Vatican Museums, Sistine Chapel and the four major basilicas of Rome. Next we travel to the Amalfi Coast to visit some beautiful villages perched on the cliffs of the Mediterranean Sea. On Sunday we visit the great monastery of Monte Cassino, where St. Benedict established the Benedictine order, then on to Assisi. In Assisi, we'll pray at the special sites in the lives of St. Francis and St. Clare, including the church at San Damiano and the Porziuncola. On Tuesday, we'll visit the summer home and retreat of the popes, Castel Gandolfo, and on Wednesday, Oct. 8, we fly back home to Portland.

We'll have Mass and prayers daily as we tour these sacred sites. Our pilgrims have been meeting monthly to prepare for the trip. Now we are ready to go! Fr. Jim Galluzzo has graciously agreed to preside at our Masses here at St. Clare while I am away. Again, please keep us in your prayers, and know that we are praying for you too. ~ Fr. Don

"This and That" from Deacon Bill... Archangels and Guardian Angels

This coming week we celebrate two feast days honoring angels. On Monday, we pay tribute to the Archangels – Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael who are all mentioned by name in the Bible, and on Thursday, we remember our Guardian Angels. We all have one.

Here are some thoughts on angels by St. Gregory the Great from the Divine Office.

You should be aware that the word "angel' denotes a function rather than a nature. Those holy spirits of heaven have indeed always been spirits. They can only be called angels when they deliver some message. Those who deliver messages of lesser importance are called angels. And those who proclaim messages of supreme importance are called archangels. And so it was that the Archangel Gabriel was sent to the Virgin Mary. It was only fitting that the highest angel should come to announce the greatest of all messages. Some angels are given proper names to denote the service they are empowered to perform. In that holy city, where perfect knowledge flows from the vision of God, those who have no names may easily be known. Personal names are assigned to some. Not because they could not be known without them, but rather to denote their ministry when they come among us. Thus, Michael means "Who is like God", Gabriel is "The Strength of God", and Raphael is "God's Remedy".

Whenever some act of wondrous power must be performed, Michael is sent, so that his action and name may make it clear that no one can do what God does by his superior power. So also, our ancient foe (the devil) desired in his pride to be like God, saying: "I will ascend into heaven; I will exalt my throne above the stars of heaven; I will be like the most high." He will be allowed to remain in power until the end of the world when he will be destroyed in the final punishment. Then, he will fight with the Archangel Michael. As we are told by John, "A battle was fought with Michael, the Archangel." So too, Gabriel, who was called God's Strength, was sent to Mary. He came to announce the One who appeared as a humble man to quell the cosmic powers. Thus, God's Strength announced the coming of the Lord of the heavenly powers, mighty in battle. Raphael means, as I have said, God's Remedy, for when he touched Tobit's eyes in order to cure him, he banished the darkness of his blindness. Thus, since he is sent to heal, he is rightly called God's Remedy.

Places where the Archangels are mentioned in the Bible:

Michael – Old Testament book of Daniel 10:13, 10:21, 12:1. New Testament book of Jude 1:9 and Book of Revelations 12: 7-9.

Gabriel - Old Testament book of Daniel 8:16, 9:21. New Testament Luke 1:19 and 1:26.

Raphael – In the Book of Tobit, Raphael is sent to Tobit and Sarah since both pray for death (Chapter 4). He travels with Tobit's son, Tobiah, and makes all things right and finally reveals that he is an angel sent by God (Chapter 12). By traveling along with Tobiah, he is the best example of a guardian angel.

Let us pray: "Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here, ever this day be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen."


