

Fr. Don's Musings . . .

This weekend we celebrate our St. Clare parish family. Sunday we have our big combined Mass and St. Clare Picnic.

Our parish has been loving and serving God for MANY years: our first Mass took place in a neighborhood house in 1913 and we broke ground for our first church on Sept. 17 of that same year, 112 years ago! Since then we have grown into a vibrant church family. Our current church building was dedicated in 1950. St. Clare Church has a vibrant K-8 school with 230 students and a strong preschool/daycare with 75 children. Our preschool is the largest Catholic parish-based preschool in Oregon. Both the preschool and the school provide a wonderful faith-filled environment for the children to learn and grow.

The St. Clare Parish campout is by far the biggest Catholic church campout in the state. Parishioners have been enjoying it since the 1970s. We usually have 75-80 families attending the campout and about 200 parishioners at the outdoor Mass. It's a highlight of the summer for many of us.

St. Clare Junque and Jewels Rummage Sale is the biggest Catholic church rummage sale in the state. It's huge! And a fun time for lots of volunteers and a chance for parishioners and neighbors to get "stuff" at great bargain prices. It's also a really good fundraiser for the parish ministries. (\$30,000 this year!)

St. Clare Church has a lot of outreach ministries: our St. Vincent de Paul council brings food to hungry families and sometimes helps them with rent or utilities. Our Andre Bessette team prepares and serves a nutritious hot meal monthly on Burnside in Old Town. Our Giving Tree project feeds over 100 local families with Christmas food. The school and preschool regularly do outreach projects to help the less fortunate.

I'm proud to be the pastor of St. Clare Church/School/ Preschool. This is a vibrant church with a long history of loving and serving our God. You are part of that history. Let's continue to make history here at St. Clare as we follow Jesus Christ. ~ Fr. Don

"This and That" from Deacon Bill . . . St. Carlo Acutis

This Sunday, Blessed Carlo Acutis will be canonized as a new saint in the Catholic Church. Carlo was born in 1991 and died at the early age of 15 in 2006. He had an advanced, incurable, painful form of leukemia and died from a cerebral hemorrhage. During his time in the hospital the doctors asked him about his pain, and he responded that many people suffer much more than me. His parents heard him offering his suffering for Jesus, Pope Benedict, and the Church.



The process of canonization requires two miracles as documented by a person or persons praying to the possible saint for intercession to God to cure an illness. The first miracle that enabled Carlo to be beatified was the cure of an 11-year-old boy in Brazil who had a pancreatic disorder from a birth defect. In 2013, the family prayed to Carlo and had the opportunity for the boy to touch a relic at his parish church during a celebration of Our Lady of Aparecida. He was cured the next day. The second miracle attributed to Carlo was the healing of a young woman from Costa Rica She was studying in Florence, Italy and suffered a brain hemorrhage after a bicycle accident. In 2022, her mother went to Assisi to pray at Carlo's' tomb and left a note. Within a day the hemorrhage had completely disappeared, and she was cured. This second miracle cleared the way to canonization which was to take place on April 27, 2025. Unfortunately, Pope Francis' death delayed the canonization until this weekend.

Carlo, born in London and raised in Milan, Italy, displayed a remarkable talent for computer programing and a deep love for Christ in the Eucharist. Inspired by St. Francis of Assisi, he was an exceptional young teenager who enjoyed sports and making many friends. Boys and girls alike enjoyed his companionship embracing shy classmates and comforting those who were bullied.

Carlo had a great deep Catholic spirituality attending Mass daily and confession weekly. He spent many hours in adoration in front of Jesus in the Eucharist within the tabernacle of his church which enabled him to say, "the Eucharist is my highway to heaven." He used his computer skills to spread true faith and belief in the Real Presence. For over four years, Carlo researched 136 Eucharistic miracles and shared them with the world. You may remember a few years ago, right here at St. Clare, a presentation of his work was displayed around the church with posters highlighting some of those miracles.

Many regarded Carlo as a computer genius who mastered and used the internet, designed websites and created short videos that will live on in years to come because of his interest and belief in the Eucharist as truly being The Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus. As the first millennial saint, he is an outstanding role model for our youth today inspiring them to use their talents for the glory of God. He modeled his life after St. Francis and as a result, his body lies in a glass tomb at Assisi, the place where Francis and Clare are buried. His feast day will be on October 12, the day Jesus welcomed him home.


