Our learning

Learning through food

The children had lots of fun with our topic books last half term. We had a big focus on food. We started the May with a visit from Saeeda who came in to show the children how to make roti bread. The children enjoyed mixing, rolling, cooking and eating the flatbreads. It was such a fun session. If any other parents would like to come in and share a cooking session with the children please let us know. We would love to see you and can provide the ingredients.

We then extended our bread making to 'bread on a stick' in Forest School. The children helped to prepare the dough the day before so that it was ready to roll and twist around the cooking stick. It tasted lovely.

The food theme continued with the children exploring the fruits from our story Handa's Surprise. They got to handle, smell, touch and eat a variety of tropical fruits such as avocado, mango, passion fruit and guava. At the end of half term the children noticed the ripe elderflowers in the garden. They helped to harvest the flowers and turned them into cordial. The finished drink was very refreshing and went down a treat.


