
This term the children have been listening to the story of The Little Red Hen and following the message of the story by helping each other and working together to reach to an end shared goal. The children have also been making bread.

Other news

Summer shoes

Please ensure that your child has suitable footwear for nursery. In the summer time it is tempting to let your child wear flip flops or sliding shoes. We do not recommend this type of footwear at Chestnut as they do not provide adequate support.

Sliders and other slip on shoes will mean that your child often uses their toes to grip onto the shoes and to stop them from falling off. This puts strain on the toes and doesn't allow them to use the whole foot when standing up and moving about. A shoe that has an adjustable fastening means that they can stay on little feet securely allowing young children balance using their whole foot.

ensure a smooth transition.
