From the Desk of Fr. Tim

Dear Friends in Christ.

A blessed Advent to you on this second Sunday of Advent. We have some penance services in the Southern deanery to help you cleanse your souls (by God's grace) and prepare for the upcoming celebration of Christmas. The pastors in the Southern deanery decided to have one penance service at each parish family in the deanery. The penance services are: Dec. 10 at St Rose in Longview, Dec. 15 at St. John's, Dec. 16 at St. Joseph's, and Dec. 23 at Holy Redeemer. All services will begin at 6 pm. If you don't have an opportunity to come to a regularly scheduled time for confession, please come to one of these deanery penance services.

Back to my pilgrimage to Greece. We drove to Corinth, which is a short drive west of Athens. We visited the archeological site which is only partially exposed. There is still much to be uncovered. They have discovered that many modern homes have been built over the site. Imagine how long it will take to negotiate with the people to move to another location so that they can uncover the ancient ruins. St. Paul was in this area for guite some time. He wrote two letters that we know of to the Corinthians. It was an important place in Church history. Unlike some of the other sites that we visited, this one had very few visitors the day we were there. We were able to celebrate Mass at the site. It was a very windy day. Celebrating the Mass outside was challenging. What kind of challenges did Paul have while bringing the Gospel to these people? He may have had to stride against the strong winds of opposition as he brought them the Good News. After our visit here, we drove back to Athens for one more night.

The next day began the sea voyage part of our pilgrimage. As we drove out of Athens to the port of Lavrion, we stopped at St. Barbara church for Mass. This is one of the few Roman Catholic churches in Greece. It's a small, beautiful church that seats about 100 people. After the windy Mass outside that we experienced the day before, I appreciated having the Mass inside a church again. The Gospel reading for that day (Lk 8:16-18) was about not hiding a lamp but placing it somewhere so that it can be seen and shed light. I talked about how St. Paul was a light that was very visible. He brought the light of Christ to this part of the world. We are called to also be the light of Christ for the world. St. Paul, through his witness, is still being a light of Christ for the world. We are called to follow his example.

It was a short drive from the church to the port. After going through the boarding process, we got on the ship and soon left the port. We sailed to the island of Mykonos and arrived at about 6 pm. We had some time to walk about the town. There were plenty of tourists walking amongst the shops and restaurants. I

enjoyed going through the narrow and winding passageways. After a short excursion, we went back to the ship for a late dinner.

DECEMBER 7, 2025

We sailed to Kusadasi, Turkey. This would be our only stop in Turkey on our pilgrimage. It was a 20-minute drive by bus to Mary's house in Ephesus. It is tradition that Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and John the Evangelist lived in this house after Pentecost. It is quite small. Because of the line of people that was going through the house, we were not able to spend much time inside. Some members of our group were disappointed because they were really looking forward to being there, and the experience was over quickly. There was not much we could do. The employees there had to keep people moving so that everybody had the chance to see it.

A Franciscan priest walked us a short distance to a chapel where we were able to have Mass. It was nice to have the privacy and not be rushed. We celebrated the feast of the Assumption of the BVM. It seemed appropriate to celebrate this feast in this special place. After the Mass, most of our group had gone back through the grounds while I put things away in the chapel. I came out of the building and noticed that there was no line of people to get into Mary's house! I thought, "What an opportunity," and I wondered why none of the rest of my group had not gone back there. I walked into Mary's house and spent some time there praying. It was a gift to be able to do this. I caught up with my group after a while and we walked back to the bus.

We drove to the ruins at Ephesus. Our guide walked us through the ruins explaining various things. I thought the site was well preserved. It was the hottest day (Sept. 23) of our trip so far. Our guide told us that in this part of Turkey the temperature can reach 125 degrees in July and August. St. Paul had success in Ephesus. "He entered the synagogue, and for three months debated boldly with persuasive arguments about the kingdom of God. ... This continued for two years with the result that all the inhabitants of the province of Asia heard the word of the Lord, Jews and Greeks alike." (Acts 19:8, 10) Despite the heat, it was a great experience "walking along the footsteps of St. Paul," especially in this place where he had much success. We were also grateful to have been in the place where tradition says that our Blessed Mother had lived. More of the pilgrimage to come.

PHASE 1 LISTENING SESSIONS SYNTHESIS

What Are Our Challenges? What Are Our Opportunities?

During the listening sessions, several key themes emerged regarding challenges within the wider community and our parish family. Participants expressed "widespread concern about homelessness, mental illness, and lack of resources or effective outreach." There were also immigration-related concerns and an awareness that there is a large, unchurched population.

Another recurring theme focused on serving the sick, disabled and elderly—particularly those in care homes—as well as serving young people, married couples, and teens, in addition to people with disabilities and special needs. Participants emphasized that these groups are in need of greater attention and accompaniment.

A number of challenges were identified within the parish family itself. Many noted a "lack of engagement and volunteerism," with "the same individuals repeatedly volunteering while others are unaware or uninvited." Participants also shared concern about the "lack of youth participating in the faith" and a "decline in religious engagement or involvement by parishioners who only attend Mass without contributing or engaging in parish life." There was a shared sense that "we need to build a community where everyone feels comfortable and welcome, whether young or elderly."

Participants highlighted "the need to reach out to isolated people—homebound, singles and young families" as well as confusion about the parish family structure, lack of updates, and unclear financial transparency. Another challenge identified was "difficulty uniting the diverse communities within the parish family" and a "lack of cohesive community between language and cultural differences". The Vietnamese community mentioned the lack of bilingual Bibles and raised security concerns in the event of an emergency or threat.

In addition to these challenges, many expressed a strong desire for community and unity—not only within the parish family but among other parishes as well. There was a call to "unite as a family," to "serve the community cheerfully and make it stronger," to invite new people, and to "evangelize and be the Body of Christ." The sessions also reflected gratitude for the "blessing of having a Hispanic community" and encouraged efforts to reach out and invite more Hispanics to expand the Hispanic community.

Participants also identified a number of opportunities within our parish family and the wider community to effectively serve and accompany others. These included engaging youth and young families through mentorship, support, and faith formation; reaching out to young adults to "encourage and support them to be married in the Catholic Church;" and "reconnecting with the 'unchurched' who have drifted away." Many emphasized the importance of promoting sacramental education and vocational awareness, and building a community that fosters "intergenerational and intercultural relationships."

There was also strong interest in sharing resources, ministries, and programs while respecting the diversity of worship styles, and in increasing outreach to the unhoused, immigrants, people struggling economically, and those with unplanned pregnancies. Participants agreed that a need exists to increase the number of volunteers to implement services both within and outside of the church. They suggested increasing and focusing announcements regarding the need for servers and expressed enthusiasm for creating a vocational ministry, ministries for prisoners, and a ministry for the elderly.

Other ideas included focusing on praying the Rosary in English and Spanish and "creating small groups for support and that provide Eucharistic ministry, healing and conversion." Together, these ideas reflected a shared vision of a more connected, compassionate and inclusive parish family—one that welcomes, serves, and unites all members of the Body of Christ.


