From the Treasurer

Financials for May were in great shape. Income was \$238 greater than budget, and \$305 less than last year.

Expenses were \$12,000 less than budget, and only \$662 greater than last year. We have several items that we have not yet spent money on that are planned. We delayed spending \$1,800 for refurbishing the front gate area, \$3,200 because we have not been able to hire a part time maintenance person, \$3,700 for not yet needing to repair Aerators, and \$600 for septic field maintenance. Garbage Disposal was \$900 lower as we worked off a credit from John's, from the fourth quarter of last year, and Maintenance Payroll was \$900 lower as hours worked were about half of what was budgeted.

Over the months of May through September, the park historically spends more money than it takes in. I have built up a balance of \$69,000 in Operational funds to cover the park overdrafts during this time frame. We have a Reserve balance of \$254,000 to which we contribute \$3,765 (\$15 times 251 units) every month. This is where the funding of capital projects, like the tennis/pickle ball courts this year, and the pool and road repairs last year, comes from.

Munson arrived the week before last to install the net posts for the new tennis court and two pickle ball courts. Next on the plan would be to eliminate any depressions and elevations in the new surface, install center tie downs, a four-foot fence between the tennis court and the pickle ball courts and between the two pickleball courts, and apply a fiberglass finish. Finally, 2 coats of acrylic and 2 coats of color (dark blue and medium green) will be applied, and 2-inch-wide white lines would be masked and painted. The total cost, which was budgeted for \$150,000, is still good and I am hoping for this project to be completed around the 4th of July. Just last week we processed a check of \$70,080 as the first installment.

One thing which I shouldn't need to point out is that the tennis/pickle ball courts are meant for FOOT TRAFFIC only. In fact, there is a sign on the entrance gate that says No Wheels and No Pets. It was very disappointing to see a picture of a motorcycle within the enclosure a couple of weeks ago. I must stress that everyone needs to stay off the surface until it is completed. Any defects found are Munson responsibility to fix. <u>Any damage that we may cause would at our expense to repair</u>.

Oh, by the way, thank you to all of the 117 owners who voted for my reelection to the Board of Directors for another two years. I very much appreciate the confidence you have in me.

From The Secretary:

Thank you all for welcoming me as part of the Willow Run Board. I don't have much to report having been on the job for only a few days, but as I met with Joan in the office yesterday, we will be working on navigating the changes in the website, along with creating additional options for timely communication.

Numerous owners have already met with me about some of their individual concerns and suggestions and I appreciate their candor. I ask that you be patient with me as I learn this job and know that I am listening to you (and writing it down in my notebook!) and will work hard to support the positive growth and sense of community that has been a part of Willow Run for over 40 years. Park Project Updates:

- Park Main Entrance Thank you to Peter Arnold for heading this project up and working on our landscaping. We have a little more to go with lighting and new flags, but we are looking great thanks to him!
- <u>Septic Fields</u> Although some repairs were made last season, the septic field on the hill was not properly maintained in the past and will need more attention this year. Neil Berkowitz will be heading up this project for the park. Thank you, Neil, for again taking this on as well as many other projects!
- <u>WE Energies Transformers</u> WE Energies is still making its way through the park replacing the old transformers with new ones. This necessary updated is badly needed and we appreciate their communication as we get this taken care of. When
- <u>Playground</u> We are looking for volunteers to make new wheels for the train for this year (about 28). Davey has already started the templates but is looking for someone to take this project over. Please contact Dave Filippello if you are interested in taking over this project.

Pool Rules

The board and the lifeguard team would like to remind you of the following very important rules. Please make sure you and your guests follow them.

- Walk in the pool area.
- Adults must accompany all children under 12 in the pool area and always supervise them.
- Inflatable rings/water wings are only allowed in the shallow end. Foam jackets and vests can go beyond the rope, but adults should be always watching their non-skilled swimmers.
- No splash zone on the far end near the shuffleboards, no splashing or jumping there is allowed.
- No swimming in either pool for the duration of the 10 minutes breaks (10 minutes before every hour). REMEMBER the lifeguards cannot begin their required 10-minute break until everyone is out of the pool.)
- Please close umbrellas when you leave and no one else takes over the table. This will save them in the winds and assist in closing time for the guards.
- Glass Containers are NOT ALLOWED. Period. Leave them at home.
- Dogs are not allowed within 50 feet of the clubhouse or playground.
- No gum or tobacco/vaping products.
- Food and drinks have to always stay behind the blue line. Please clean up your trash and spills to keep the area clean and bugs to a minimum. The guards are there for safety NOT to clean up.
- No diaper changes allowed in the pool area.
- The pool is heated but the kiddle pool is not.
- Please no profanity or foul language at the pool area, especially when children are present.
- If an incident occurs, the lifeguard may have to clear the pool area to handle it. Please respect their job duties.
- Lifeguards are there to protect all patrons (including turtles!). Please treat them with respect and follow what they say at all times.






- Shower before entering the pool and after use of the toilet facilities.
- Do not enter the pool if you have an open cut or any communicable disease.
- Do not bring food, drink, gum or tobacco into the pool.
- No running or rough play is allowed in the pool area.
- No animals allowed in the pool area, except for service animals.
- No glass or plastic that can shatter is allowed in the pool area.
- Diaper changing on the pool deck is prohibited.

Start of Season Reminders from the official Rules & Regulations of Willow Run

Unit owners are responsible for reading and familiarizing themselves with the full document and are responsible to make sure that their family members, guests and tenants are aware of all rules and regulations. This is not a complete list of all rules, but a sampling of the ones that receive the most questions.

- Monthly Dues Your payment of \$125 is due by the 1st of each month.
 - Payments must be sent to PO Box 566, Elkhorn, WI 53121 or electronically by Zelle to <u>willowrundues@gmail.com</u>
 - No payments will be accepted at the main office or the accounting firm.
 - Fees may be paid monthly, quarterly, semi-annually, or yearly as long as they are received by the first of the month in which they are due.
- Owner Emails the park is sending important information by email to save on time and money. Please make sure that your email is on file with the office ASAP. You can choose to not have your email published in the directory but will receive correspondence from the office.
- Additions and Construction All unit owners must apply for Architectural Control Committee and Board approval prior to seeking County or Township permits.
 - Forms are available at the office or by emailing <u>willowrunrv@gmail.com</u>
 - o This includes sheds.
- Golf Carts must be insured, and the unit number clearly marked on the front and back.
 - Only drivers eligible for a driver's license are allowed. No children (even on laps) may drive the carts.
 - All carts must maintain the park speed limit and all posted signage.
- Bicycles, scooters, electric scooters, hoverboards must follow the park speed limit and all posted signage as well.
- Dogs must always be leashed and kept 50 feet from the clubhouse, beaches, pool and tennis courts
- **Beaches and Lakes** are all swim at your own risk, no lifeguard is on duty.
- **Disturbances** Quiet hours are Sunday Thursday from 10pm until 8am, Friday, Saturday and holidays between the hours of 11:30pm and 8am.
- Holiday Dumpsters and Regular Dumpsters
 - Refuse & Recycling must be placed in the appropriate dumpsters, not on the sides
 - o Brush Pile is only for wood landscaping materials (not grass clippings or furniture)
 - The regular dumpsters are not for construction projects (a small amount from home improvement is ok). The park is charged extra when we put too much construction debris in them or large items like couches or mattresses. The large dumpsters that the park gets for holiday weekends are for those bulky items and some construction debris. If you're doing a construction project, please remember that it is up to the homeowner to get their own dumpster. Please be mindful and respectful of these guidelines so the park can keep costs under control.

9 Things you shouldn't pour down the drain or garbage disposal

- 1. **Eggshells:** Eggshells cause blockages. Sharp, hard edges of the shell will stick to the drain.
- 2. **Grease:** Grease will stick to the inside of your pipes and the pipes going out into the street. This will cause the entire pipe to become clogged.
- 3. **Flour:** The flour will coagulate when mixed with water. This can clog your pipes by coating the edges and catching other bits of disposables trying to make their way down the pipe. Throw flour in the garbage.
- 4. **Produce stickers**: When washing fruit, do not forget to take the sticker off so it doesn't fall into the sink. They will stick to the pipes and cause a buildup.
- 5. **Coffee Grounds:** Grounds build up in your pipes and cause blockages. Grounds are the most common cause of drain problems.
- 6. **Products claiming to be "flushable".** Flushable products such as certain brands of cat litter and wipes are a high risk for clogging. Flushable wipes also don't break down properly and get caught on other things, creating large clogs in pipes.
- 7. **Paint**: Do not pour paint, or wash paintbrushes in sink. It will cause stickiness and create a condition for possible backup.
- 8. **Paper Products:** They are bulky and don't breakdown. They will attach themselves to other buildup in the drain. And finally....
- 9. **Expandable Food**: Foods made from flour like pasta will continue to expand and attach itself to other elements in the pipes.

4 Easy homemade Drain Cleaners

- Pour ½ cup baking soda, followed by ½ cup vinegar down drain.
- Plug drain and let sit for one hour
- Then, pour a pot of boiling water down drain. Repeat if necessary
- Pour ½ cup baking soda, followed by ½ cup lemon juice down drain.
- Plug drain and let sit for one hour.
- Finish with a pot of boiling water.
- Mix $\frac{1}{2}$ cup table salt and $\frac{1}{2}$ cup baking soda together and pour down drain.
- Let sit for about 30 minutes (or overnight if clog is tough).
- Follow with a pot of boiling water.
- Pour ½ cup baking soda, ½ cup salt and 2 tablespoons cream of tartar in a jar that seals.
- Close jar and shake to combine ingredients.
- Pour half the jar's contents down the drain and save the other half for later.
- Let drain sit for one hour. Then run tap water to rinse any remaining solution.

- Instant Power Septic Shock
- Bio-clean Drain Septic 2#
- Green Gobbler Drain and grease trap cleaner
- Drain Fix and Septic Restorer
- Liquid Plumber

Please Note: Only use "septic safe" toilet paper in your toilet.
