BGCNLT| Spelling Bee | Official Rules

1. Eligibility is determined by the member's official grade in school on the day of the preliminary event. If requested by a parent, a member may compete in an older age group. Each member may participate only once in the competition.
2. This is an oral competition. There is no practice round.
3. The contestant may request the pronouncer to pronounce the word **one** additional time. No other information about the definition, etymology, or history of a word will be given.
4. The contestant may request the pronouncer to use the word in a sentence **one** time, and **one additional time** if the word is a homophone and is previously used in a sentence
5. Having started to spell a word, a contestant may stop and start over **once**. Letters or their sequence may be changed in the respelling.
6. Each additional age group round will increase in difficulty. Each contestant remaining in the Bee at the start of the round shall spell one word in the round, except when only two participants remain as provided in rule 10.
7. Upon missing the spelling of a word, a contestant immediately drops out of the contest, except when only two participants remain as provided in rule 10.
8. If none of the contestants remaining in the Bee at the start of a round spells a word correctly during the round, all shall remain in the competition.
9. In the case of a round surpassing 5 words correctly spelled, the pronouncer will then skip to a higher grade level word list.
10. When the number of spellers is reduced to two, the elimination procedure changes. At that point, when one speller misspells a word, the other speller shall be given an opportunity to spell that same word. If the same speller spells that word correctly, plus the next word on the list, then the second speller shall be declared the champion.
11. If one of the last two spellers misspells a word and the other speller, after correcting the error, misspells the new word, then the misspelled new word shall be referred to the other speller. If this other speller then succeeds in correcting the error and spells the next word, then he or she shall be declared the champion.
12. An oral appeal relating to the Spelling Bee must be made to the head judge by a Boys & Girls Club employee accompanying that member before the contestant affected would have received his/her next word had he/she stayed in the contest.
13. The judges' decision shall be final on all questions.
14. Each individual club/site/unit may send one winner from each grade (K-6) to compete.

In the finals, there will be a 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winner for each grade (K-6). The winners will compete in Reno on Apr 27, 2024 at the Boys & Girls Club of Truckee Meadows 9:30am check-in and 10:00am competition begins.



BGCNLT | Concurso de Ortografía | Reglas Oficiales

1. La elegibilidad se determina según el grado oficial del miembro en la escuela el día del evento preliminar. Si lo solicita un parentesco, un miembro puede competir en un grupo de edad mayor. Cada miembro puede participar solo una vez en la competencia.
2. Esta es una competencia oral. No hay una ronda de práctica.
3. El concursante puede solicitar al pronunciador que pronuncie la palabra una vez adicional. No se dará ninguna otra información sobre la definición, etimología o historia de una palabra.
4. El concursante puede solicitar al pronunciador que utilice la palabra en una oración una vez, y una vez adicional si la palabra es un homófono y se ha utilizado previamente en una oración.
5. Después de haber comenzado a deletrear una palabra, un concursante puede detenerse y comenzar de nuevo una vez. Las letras o su secuencia pueden cambiarse en la nueva escritura.
6. Cada ronda adicional por grupo de edad aumentará en dificultad. Cada concursante que permanezca en el Concurso al inicio de la ronda deberá deletrear una palabra en la ronda, excepto cuando solo queden dos participantes según lo dispuesto en la regla 10.
7. Al cometer un error al deletrear una palabra, un concursante queda eliminado inmediatamente del concurso, excepto cuando solo queden dos participantes según lo dispuesto en la regla 10.
8. Si ninguno de los concursantes que permanezcan en el Concurso al inicio de una ronda deletrea correctamente una palabra durante la ronda, todos permanecerán en la competencia.
9. En caso de que una ronda supere las 5 palabras deletreadas correctamente, el pronunciador pasará a una lista de palabras de un nivel de grado superior.
10. Cuando el número de deletreadores se reduzca a dos, el procedimiento de eliminación cambiará. En ese momento, cuando un deletreador cometa un error al deletrear una palabra, al otro deletreador se le dará la oportunidad de deletrear esa misma palabra. Si el mismo deletreador deletrea esa palabra correctamente, más la siguiente palabra en la lista, entonces el segundo deletreador será declarado campeón.
11. Si uno de los dos últimos deletreadores comete un error al deletrear una palabra y el otro deletreador, después de corregir el error, comete un error al deletrear la nueva palabra, entonces la palabra nueva deletreada incorrectamente se referirá al otro deletreador. Si este otro deletreador logra corregir el error y deletrea la siguiente palabra, entonces él o ella será declarado campeón.
12. Una apelación oral relacionada con el Concurso de Ortografía debe ser hecha al juez principal por un empleado del Club de Niños y Niñas que acompañe a ese miembro antes de que el concursante afectado hubiera recibido su próxima palabra si hubiera permanecido en el concurso.
13. La decisión de los jueces será definitiva en todas las cuestiones.
14. Cada club/sitio/unidad individual puede enviar un ganador de cada grado (K-6) para competir.

En la final, habrá un ganador de 1er, 2do y 3er lugar para cada grado (K-6). Los ganadores competirán en Reno el 27 de abril de 2024 en el Club de Niños y Niñas de Truckee Meadows. El registro comienza a las 9:30 a.m. y la competencia a las 10:00 a.m.
