2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT



The second Sunday of Lent always gives us an account of the transfiguration. Jesus asked Peter, James and John to go with him to the mountain top. While they were there, Jesus was transfigured and became dazzling white before them. Along with Jesus stood Moses and Elijah. The voice of God announced that Jesus was his son and that all should listen to him. The disciples were frightened, but Jesus calmed them. When Peter, James and John looked up, Jesus was the only one left . . . the one to whom we need to listen. Consider your community, family, relatives, and people at work or school. Who is struggling right now because of a recent change? How is this change darkening their world? Once you have identified the person (or people) and their situation, think of one way as a family you can be a light to them. Our action is our response to listening to Jesus.



GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR NEXT SUNDAY

The Third Sunday of Advent *Matthew 11: 2-22*

I cannot count the times people have come to me troubled by doubts. I have begun to believe that doubt is really healthy evidence that there is reflection and searching going on. That's better than just sliding along without any wonder or pushing the limits of faith. In this season we hear about others who have had doubts. Zechariah is one of them right at the beginning of the New Testament. Then there is Joseph who didn't just leap into faith and trust the news about Mary. Perhaps the greatest doubter is at the center of next week's Gospel. John sits in Harrod's prison wondering why his cousin from Nazareth does not come to get him out sending his disciples with that question: "Are you the one?" His doubt springs from the fact that too often our expectation of how God should behave does not match the way God really does behave. John wanted an unquenchable fire, power and punishment. What he got back was a quote from Isaiah 35 which he probably knew by heart. If there is a conflict between our expectations and God's work in this world, we must look to Jesus as John did. If we want to know where God is, start with those who are serving the blind the lame, the outcast and poor. Look at advocates for a just wage, affordable housing and compassion. Jesus is always found where there is healing, uniting, and encouraging.

What we have to start sensing is that in the spiritual life, joy is embracing sorrow and happiness, pain and pleasure. It is deeper, fuller. It is more. It is something that remains with us. BEING A GOOD STEWARD DURING ADVENT



Practical Ways to Practice Stewardship During Advent

- **Give Thoughtful Gifts:** Consider handmade or homemade gifts that express creativity, care, and personal connection.
- Engage in Worship: Attend worship regularly and participate in the liturgy and sacraments to deepen your spiritual life.
- Cultivate Gratitude and Prayer: Pray for God's guidance and blessing in your life and the world. Give thanks for your family, friends, church community, and co-workers. Begin small acts of gratitude—such as writing a note of appreciation or offering words of encouragement.
- **Practice Kindness and Generosity:** Perform random acts of kindness for both strangers and friends. Praise your child simply for being unique and worthy as a child of God.
- **Support Charitable Causes:** Contribute to organizations that align with your faith and values, helping those in need during this season of giving.
- Care for Creation: Learn about social and environmental issues affecting God's creation and take steps to make a positive difference.
- **Connect with Others:** Be attentive to opportunities to connect with those you know and those you encounter in your daily routines.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Formerly called Last Rites or Extreme Unction, this Sacrament is for those experiencing a serious illness, facing an operation or dying. Anointing of the Sick should be performed before death is imminent, when a person is conscious and able to receive comfort from the sacrament. We make every effort to provide pastoral care and the sacrament of anointing to all who request it; however, families are encouraged to call sooner rather than later. If a loved one is at home and needs the sacrament, please call the office at 592-1949 to arrange for a priest to visit.

In the Hospital?

Please ask the nurse to contact the parish that serves the Hospital you are in for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.

This is the most efficient way to be sure you or your loved one will receive the sacrament. Be aware that because of HIPAA Privacy regulations, hospitals do not necessarily notify the parish regarding your hospitalization unless requested by the patient.

IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A GIFT TO OUR PARISH USING YOUR IRA AND IF:

reducing your adjusted gross income.

- 1. You are at least 70 $^{1/2}$ years old on the date you make your gift.
- 2. Your IRA is a traditional (some Roth IRA's may qualify).
- 3. You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions.

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of federal income tax, and it will count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD).

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution." In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT! Your gift <u>must</u> go directly from your IRA to our Parish. If you receive the money first, then you will be taxed on it like any other distribution.

Example:

Bill has \$125,000 in a traditional IRA and would like to contribute \$5,000 as his yearly gift to his Parish. Upon hearing of the Charitable IRA Rollover opportunity, he directs the custodian of his IRA to transfer this amount not later than December 31, 2025 directly to the Parish as the family's 2025 gift. He will not be subject to income tax on the \$5,000 donation.


