3RD SUNDAY OF LENT



Jesus approached a Samaritan woman at Jacob's well and asked her for a drink of water. This surprised the woman for several reasons. In the first place, it was unlikely that a man would ask a woman for anything and even more unbelievable that Jesus, a Jew, would ask something of a Samaritan, a great enemy of the Jewish people. Jesus explained to her that our thirst would return if we drank water from the well; but if we drank the water Jesus offered us, we would never thirst again. After Jesus told her many things about herself, she came to believe that he was the Son of God and called others to him. Jesus offers us living water just as he did the woman at the well. It is the water of salvation so when we stumble, we know that Jesus refreshes us with forgiveness. This is helpful to remember on days when we are disappointed by our anger, impatience, and discouragement.

GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR NEXT SUNDAY**The Fourth Sunday of Lent***John 9: 1-41*

Next week we get a story about some smart people who can't see what is right in front of them, and a blind man who learns to see. Notice how he progresses in recognizing Jesus. First, he is the "man." Then, he is a "prophet." Finally, he is Jesus the "Lord." Then there are the Pharisees who knew the prophets and what to look for. They knew perfectly well what the Messiah would be like. An old story is still a real story today. There is a lot of blindness in this world and some darkness in us all. For reasons of prejudice, ignorance, stubbornness, ill will, or hurt, we simply will not see what is right in front of us. Sometimes what we think we know can blind us to the truth and leave us in darkness. If we would listen to the scriptures, we could see the presence of God in people who are right in front of us even those we might be inclined to call "sinners," "criminals," or any of the other names we are using these days to deny the truth that we are all children of God who deserve dignity and respect. We ought not make the foolish mistake of those Pharisees. To do so will leave us in a darkness we can never imagine while the Light of Christ, the Light of Life, the Light Truth shines for those who want to see and will do what Christ Jesus asks.



METANOIA – A CHANGE OF HEART

As we begin, we might consider a Greek word that resonates deeply during the season of Lent: metanoia. Just the sound of it challenges us and commands our attention. Literally, the word means “to change one’s mind.” In our Christian tradition, it has come to mean repentance and, even more profoundly, conversion. Merriam-Webster defines it beautifully as “a transformative change of heart.” For Catholic stewards, that phrase perfectly captures our yearning during Lent. We long to be transformed by a change of heart.

That kind of change can be unsettling. It sounds risky. It is certainly life-altering. If metanoia truly took root within us—if we allowed that heart-deep transformation into our lives—would we be different?

On the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we recall how Jesus went down to the Jordan River and asked John to baptize Him. In that moment, two men stood on the threshold of transformation. John would call others to repentance in preparation for the coming Messiah. The Spirit would lead Jesus into the desert before He began proclaiming the Kingdom of God. John would ultimately be beheaded; Jesus would be crucified. Transformation was not symbolic for them—it was total.

Are we ready to be transformed this Lenten season?

Yes, we want to “do Lent well.” We may attend extra Masses, give up chocolate, pray the Stations, or ensure our families participate in Holy Week liturgies. But metanoia? That kind of transformation alters us. It opens our hearts in radical ways.

We see such transformation in the doctor who travels to Sierra Leone to treat Ebola patients during his vacation; in the couple who, with little time for discernment, adopt three orphaned siblings so they can remain together; in the family who chooses to tithe despite financial uncertainty. Transformation requires courage. It cannot be approached casually.

Perhaps our Lenten resolve should move beyond small sacrifices or token pieties toward a deeper commitment: a daily prayer for the courage to be changed. A prayer that dares to ask for true conversion of heart.

Let this simple petition shape our Lent:

“Even if it takes time, Lord, make me smaller in the world, bigger in the Kingdom.”

Metanoia. May we rise to the challenge of Christ, who beckons us to follow Him into the desert this Lent.






