
 Understand and nurture your existing industry (BRE – business retention and expansion)

lowa Business Advantages

Tax reform:

- Single income tax bracket for all lowans reached 3.8% early in 2025
- Lowers Corporate tax gradually from 9.8% to 5.5%
- Single-factor, non-unitary corporate income tax structure
- No personal property tax in Iowa
- No property tax on new machinery and equipment purchases
- No sales and use tax on industrial machinery and equipment purchases
- No sales tax on materials used in the manufacturing process
- No sales tax on purchases of electricity or natural gas used directly in the manufacturing process



Business Recruitment Process – How We Work

- Identify the needs of client/project
- Perform research
 - Location One Information System (LOIS) website that inventories Iowa available buildings, sites and community information
 - Important to have your site and building information <u>current</u> and <u>complete</u> on LOIS
- RFI's sent to regions/communities that can meet the needs of the client – depending on project request
- Package response information and provide to client
- Client assesses the information and decides the next step – which areas to pursue
- Client continues to narrow the options; we continue to position lowa as the expansion location



Business Location Criteria

Site Selectors' Most Important Location Criteria

Certified Sites

- Certified sites fill the demand for project-ready industrial sites
 - Program designed and implemented by site selection firm Quest Site Solutions
- The key attributes that serve as the basis of the certification program:
 - Available for sale or lease with an established price and terms
 - Fully-servable -- infrastructure to the site OR developed detailed plans to build-out infrastructure with schedules and costs
 - Developable -- environmental and other related assessments (and any mitigation) are complete
 - Quicker RFI response time
- Certification allows for effective proactive and reactive marketing and participation in the state's robust marketing campaign
- Currently 24 sites are certified
- Site sizes start at 25 acres and park sizes 50 acres
- The program accepts new sites every January


High Quality Jobs Program (HQJP)

- Tax Benefits/Financial Assistance Program
- Criteria for Assistance
 - Capital investment
 - Number of jobs created/retained
 - Wages and benefits associated with jobs
 - Wage thresholds must be met for a project to be eligible based on laborshed area wages.
 Additionally, company must meet requirements for employee benefits on health insurance coverage.
 - Contract period for a project: 3 years performance plus 2 years maintenance for a total of 5 years
 - Other factors include in-state competition, company financials, type of company, etc.



Process for Accessing HQJP Assistance

- Company submits an Iowa Project Questionnaire (IPQ)
 - High-level information about the project
 - Project cannot have been initiated
- Finance team meets weekly to discuss IPQs, next steps and provide feedback
- If applicable, company completes application for financial assistance
- IEDA Board makes funding decisions at monthly meeting
 - Meets third Friday of each month



Major Economic Growth Attraction Program (MEGA)

Tax Benefits/Financial Assistance Program

- Refundable ITC up to 5% of the qualifying investment value
- Withholding tax credit up to 3% for eligible created jobs
- Refund of state sales, service or use tax
- Local property tax exemption

Criteria for Assistance

- Capital investment of \$1B or more
- Wages and benefits associated with jobs 140% of wage threshold
- Must be engaging in advanced manufacturing, biosciences or research and development
- Must locate on a certified site of 250 acres or larger

Manufacturing is lowa's largest industry sector

Accounting for over 17% of the state's GDP

Supporting Adoption of Automation

- lowa must help manufacturers integrate smart technology into their operations to remain globally competitive
- Grants for small to medium size manufacturers that invest in smart technologies
 - Technology Investment Grant Program -support manufacturers with 3-150 employees
 - Grants up to \$75,000
