
IAN & WALLY




PYGMY GOATS

Mozart and Beethoven are always getting into mischief! They do lots of silly things which make people laugh. They love their new home.








CALVES


HELGA & GEORGE

JESSIE


SHEEP

There are four highland cows at the sanctuary and their names are William, Arthur, Robert & Bruce.

HIGHLAND CATTLE

- This breed of cattle comes from Scotland.
- They are famous for their long, shaggy hair and large horns.
- They are gentle and friendly.
- They can live in harsh, cold climates.
- They are usually reddish-brown in colour but can also be black, yellow, white and brindle.
- A group of highland cattle is called a fold.





There are five alpacas at the sanctuary and their names are Tosca, Archie, Felix, Crumpet & Cushion.

ALPACAS

- Alpacas are members of the camel family.
- They come from South America.
- They do not live in the wild but live with human families instead.
- They look similar to llamas but are much smaller.
- They are famous for their wool which is much softer than sheep's wool.
- When alpacas give birth it is called unpacking!





There are lots of chickens at the sanctuary and you can meet them all when you visit.


CHICKENS

- Chickens are very smart animals. They learn quickly and can solve problems.
- They like to live in groups called flocks and they form close bonds with each other.
- A male chicken is called a rooster and a female is called a hen.
- Chickens are the closest living relative to the T-rex dinosaur!





There are two donkeys at the sanctuary. They are called Eddie and Clint. Eddie loves having a selfie taken!




DONKEYS

- The large ears of a donkey help to keep them cool.







LEFT OR RIGHT?


How many chickens are facing LEFT?


How many are facing RIGHT?






Draw some food the goat would like to eat.






