Ms. Beatrice Robinson McIntosh 74, affectionately known as "Momma Bea", formerly of Youngstown Ohio entered eternal rest Sunday, November 6, 2022 at WellStar Kennestone Hospital. Ms. McIntosh was born June 25th, 1948 in Mobile Alabama, a daughter of Pastor Jacob and Willie V. Robinson. She was the faithful wife of the late Simmie L McIntosh III for 26 years.

She was a 1966 North High Graduate and had been employed with General Electric for over 15 years. She was a 28 year member of Kingdom Nations Church in Stone Mountain Georgia formerly originated as Anointing Force Church of God in Christ in Youngstown, Ohio. It was there, in the year of 1995, where Bea McIntosh fully met the qualifications set by the church, as Missionary. She supported her leaders in a unprecedented way, and was found an outstanding supporter of her local church. Further, she evangelized and brought a gospel of love, comfort and deliverance unto those found in the projects, people's homes, hospitals, and the like. She visited the sick and shut-ins and gave physical assistance wherever needed. Missionary McIntosh was a stellar servant.

Momma Bea was also a self made entrepreneur starting several businesses in the retail and hospitality industry. In 1995 at a Church of God in Christ State Meeting she was prompted to take her passion to wear hats and became a vendor that resulted in serving countless of First Ladies and saints. In 2001 she joined with her daughter Andrea and they formed "Divine Choice Catering services where momma Bea was known for her scrumptious "potato salad." In 2010 she launched "B Sharp Fashions" a mobile boutique that serviced clients throughout the state and abroad. Momma Bea had a keen eye for fashion and carried a rich poise, class, presentation and etiquette that she so graciously deposited in her two daughters and many others.

Momma Bea loved God and had a sincere praise and worship. Her godly attributes was evident through her big smile with dimples, loving heart and a contagious love for people. She trained her children how to sing She spiritually adopted many young people including her nieces and nephews and encouraged their lives through mentorship. She loved to travel yearly and attend the COGIC Holy Convocations in Memphis while providing the young people an opportunity to travel with her and experience God on another level.

She was an avid planner who could coordinate a group trips around the country within hours to attend musicals, concerts etc just at the thought of wanting to attend. It was her quest not to miss anything that could impact her spiritual life. She hosted and participated in many annual Teas for numerous churches. In 2019, she won 1st place in raising the most money in New Beginnings Ministries in Youngstown, Ohio all while living in Atlanta. She could be found serving the elderly, helping single young mothers, providing rides, shopping, serving the bereaved families and helping them transition their homesteads immediately upon notice of death.

In 2011, Ms. McIntosh was called to the city of Atlanta to serve as a full time caretaker and shortly fell ill in 2014. She had encountered many bouts in her health but through faith she was determined to press on despite the odds of her physical ailments. She was relentless and did not allow anything to stop her from attending church or any event for her children, grand children, family or friends. Her trips to Hawaii to visit with her sister Darlene had become her new home outside the states where she became an honorary church mother.

Her love for her children could be seen throughout her illness where Andrea, Les, Lisa and their spouses all experience the significant role of caretaker all while being supported by her son Tim. It was during this stage of her life that she developed deeper relationships with her 9 siblings who met weekly for fellowship and prayer. She occupied her time to pour into her grand children providing advice, love and settle rebukes through phone calls and text.

Momma Bea will forever be missed by all. She leaves to forever cherish her memory her caretaker and oldest daughter, Lisa (Minister Patrick) Wells, Tim McIntosh, Pastors Andrea (Brian) Dean, Pastors Les L.
