

## The Mueller Assessment of Transition (MAT)

The MAT is a standardized assessment to measure older adults' wellbeing when transitioning into an assisted living facility (ALF).

The MAT was tested to measure wellbeing within the resident's *first month* of moving into the ALF.

### How Does a Resident Complete the MAT?

The MAT is completed independently by a new resident using a writing instrument (not interview style). Staff may assist with writing answers if necessary.

Can a Resident with Memory Impairment Complete the MAT? No, the MAT has not yet been tested for residents with memory impairment. New residents should be alert and oriented to complete MAT.

### What Does Staff Do with the MAT Results?

Based on the resident's answers, staff can address areas of need to help maintain or increase your resident's wellbeing during their transition into the ALF! For example, suppose a resident marked Agree to "feeling less engaged in your favorite hobbies." In that case, staff can use that information to intentionally provide person-centered activities (old or new) for that resident. Additionally, if your resident marked Strongly Agree to "feeling strong support from the staff," then the staff can use that information to keep providing excellent care to that resident.

The MAT may be used on move-in day (pre-test) and then again at the end of the resident's first month in the ALF (post-test) to assess for changes to their wellbeing.
