

C: A reading from the Holy + Gospel according to Luke.

There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test him and said, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? How do you read it?" He said in reply, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your

mind, and your neighbor as yourself." He replied to him, "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live."

But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man fell victim to robbers as he went down from Jerusalem to Jericho. They stripped and beat him and went off leaving him half-dead. A priest happened to be going down that road, but when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. Likewise a Levite came to the place, and when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight. He approached the victim, poured oil and wine over his wounds and bandaged them. Then he lifted him up on his own animal, took him to an inn and cared for him. The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper with the instruction, 'Take care of him. If you spend more than what I have given you, I shall repay you on my way back.' Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" He answered, "the one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "God and do likewise."

THE PROFESSION OF FAITH (Nicene Creed)

(please stand)

I believe in One God, the Father, the Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

I believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten not made, of one being with the Father.

Through Him all things were made. For us and for our salvation He came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit, He was born of the Virgin Mary

(here genuflect) AND BECAME MAN

For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate; He suffered death and was buried.

On the third day He rose again in fulfillment of the Scriptures; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of Life Who proceeds from the Father. With the Father and the Son, He is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic church. I acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. I look for the resurrection of the dead and the + life of the world to come. Amen.

GENERAL INTERCESSIONS

L: That we may be generous in helping others and reach out to feed, clothe and comfort especially those in need, let us pray to the Lord.

R: Lord, hear our prayer.

L: That we may respond with love to those who would seek to be our enemy or to harm us and to live in a way that always reflects the teachings and love of Christ in our everyday lives at work, school, and at home, let us pray to the Lord.

R: Lord, hear our prayer.

L: Lord our God, grant us the gift of men who will love You with all their heart, soul, strength, and mind; and their

neighbors as themselves by standing forth to become priests and deacons in Your Holy Church. Let us pray to the Lord.

R: Lord, hear our prayer.

L: That the faithful departed will find consolation in the bosom of Abraham, where Lazarus is no longer poor, especially +Bishop Jerry Rafalko, +Wanda and +Jan Rafalko, and those who died on September 11, 2001 and those who have given their lives in service of justice and freedom in our world, let us pray to the Lord.

L: For any personal needs and intentions; let us now pray quietly (*pause for reflection*). Let us pray to the Lord.

R: Lord, hear our prayer.

C: God, Your gospel of compassion calls us to put into action our love for You and our neighbor. Hear our prayers, and by Your Spirit make Your church effective as a servant of the poor, sick, and needy of our time. We ask this in the name of Jesus, the Christ.

R: Amen.

OFFERTORY VERSE

C: In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son as expiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also must love one another.



Union of Utrecht Canon

(please kneel)

Blessed are You God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Father of mercy and God of all consolation. For You so loved the world that You gave Your only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

He then established a lasting memorial of Your salvation. On the evening in which He willingly surrendered Himself, He took bread, gave You thanks, blessed it and broke it saying,

Take this all of you and eat it: FOR THIS IS MY BODY WHICH IS GIVEN FOR YOU.

When supper had ended, He took the cup. In the same way, He gave You thanks, blessed it, saying:

Take this all of you and drink from it:
FOR THIS IS THE CUP OF MY BLOOD; THE BLOOD OF
THE NEW AND EVERLASTING COVENANT, WHICH
SHALL BE SHED FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE
FORGIVENESS OF SINS.

As often as you do this, do it in remembrance of Me.


So, we recall before You, Father, the Incarnation of Your Son, His words and deeds, how He humbled Himself and obediently accepted death, even death on the cross. Therefore You have raised Him up and given Him a Name which is above every name, so that in heaven and under the earth every knee shall bow and every tongue proclaim to the glory of God the Father: Jesus Christ is Lord.

We offer this Sacrifice of Your Son before You, Father, with praise and thanksgiving and ask that You accept this oblation.

Through Him, with Him, in Him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is Yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.




COMMUNION RITE

R: Amen.



C: Let us pray together:




