

ADVENT WREATH LIGHTING CEREMONY THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

READER 1: As we come together on this Third Sunday of Advent, we come to encourage one another in our spiritual preparations to stay alert and ready for the second coming of Christ.

We also gather today in joy as we anxiously anticipate the celebration of Christmas, planning and preparing to honor the birth of our Lord and Savior.

ALL: "We shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God."

READER 2: In today's Scripture readings and Mass prayers, we shall hear that Jesus IS the Christ promised by God through His prophets, Who came to save us: "the eyes of the blind shall be opened and the ears of the deaf unstopped' and "the lame shall leap like deer, and the tongue of the mute sing for joy" and He came to "bring us pardon and freedom from the burden of our sins."

ALL: "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God."

READER 3: On this Third Sunday of Advent, we light * the first candle to remember to walk in the light of the Lord.

We light * the second candle to remember that He Who is the Light of the world baptizes us with the Holy Spirit and fire.

We light * the third candle to remember to carry the light of Christ and His salvation as the prophets had carried God's promise of a savior.

ALL: "See, the Judge is standing at the doors!"

READER 4: Dearest Jesus, You are the One Who was foretold by the prophets. And You are the One Who will return to save us for Your kingdom.

Through the Sacrament of Penance "strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees," so that we may be ready for You.

By the Sacraments of the Word and the Eucharist, may we be strengthened to work together as the Body of Christ, ministering to a suffering world.

ALL: Amen.

I promise to change my way of living so that through a deeper holiness I may better serve You throughout the rest of my life. I ask the Blessed Virgin Mary, all the saints and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord, our God.

C: May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive our sins and bring us to everlasting life.

R: Amen.

C: May our Lord, Jesus Christ, absolve you and, with His authority vested in me I absolve you from all your sins: in the name of the Father + the Son and the Holy Spirit.

READING I: Isaiah 35:1-6, 10 (please be seated)


A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah:

The desert and the parched land will exult; the steppe will rejoice and bloom. They will bloom with abundant flowers, and rejoice with joyful song. The glory of Lebanon will be given to them, the splendor of Carmel and Sharon; they will see the glory of the Lord, the splendor of our God. Strengthen the hands that are feeble, make firm the knees that are weak, say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not! Here is your God, he comes with vindication; with divine recompense he comes to save you. Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared; then will the lame leap like a stag, then the tongue of the mute will sing.

Those whom the Lord has ransomed will return and enter Zion singing, crowned with everlasting joy; they will meet with joy and gladness, sorrow and mourning will flee.

Behold, the Judge is standing before the gates. Take as an example of hardship and patience, brothers and sisters, the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

When John the Baptist heard in prison of the works of the Christ, he sent his disciples to Jesus with this question, "Are you the one who is to come, or should be look for another?" Jesus said to them in reply, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them. And blessed is the one who takes no offense at me."

As they were going off, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John, "What did you go out to the desert to see? A reed swayed by the wind? Then what did you go out to see? Someone dressed in fine clothing? Those who wear fine clothing are in royal palaces. Then why did you go out? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is the one about whom it is written:

Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way before you.


Amen, I say to you, among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he."

THE PROFESSION OF FAITH (Nicene Creed)

(please stand)

I believe in One God, the Father, the Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

I believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten not made, of one being with the Father.

Through Him all things were made. For us and for our salvation He came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit, He was born of the Virgin Mary

(here genuflect) AND BECAME MAN

For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate; He suffered death and was buried.

On the third day He rose again in fulfillment of the Scriptures; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of Life Who proceeds from the Father. With the Father and the Son, He is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic church. I acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. I look for the resurrection of the dead and the + life of the world to come. Amen.

- **L:** For any personal needs and intentions, let us now pray quietly (pause for reflection). Let us pray to the Lord.

- **C:** Most loving Father, hear the petitions of your people, waiting in faith and hope for the coming of our Savior, whose splendor brings us everlasting joy. We as this, through Christ our Lord.



EUCHARISTIC PRAYER IV

The Dutch Old Catholic Canon

(please kneel)

Blessed are You, Lord of all majesty and King of eternal glory through Your only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ.

In Him Your Word was made flesh. In Him the fullness of Your grace was revealed in splendor. In all things, He fulfilled Your will and glorified your name.

He proclaimed Your Kingdom to us. He broke the power of darkness over us. He took our guilt upon Himself. He reconciled us to You and unlocked the new paradise for us. As the Way, the Truth and the Life, he has revealed Your love to us. He humbled Himself and became obedient even to death on a cross, and by rising restored our life.

On the night in which He was betrayed to undergo that suffering which He Himself had chosen, He took bread into His hands and, lifting His eyes to You His heavenly Father, He gave thanks. He blessed the bread, broke it and gave it to His disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and eat it

FOR THIS IS MY BODY WHICH IS GIVEN FOR YOU When supper had ended, he took the cup and gave thanks to You. He blessed it, and gave it to His disciples, saying:

Take this all of you and drink from it:

FOR THIS IS THE CUP OF MY BLOOD; THE BLOOD OF THE NEW AND EVERLASTING COVENANT, WHICH SHALL BE SHED FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS.

As often as you do this, do it in remembrance of me.

Your death, Lord Jesus, we proclaim! Your resurrection we celebrate! Your return in glory we await!

Therefore, Father, we remember His saving Passion, His glorious Resurrection and His Exaltation at Your right hand. We await His coming in the fullness of majesty. We here set forth this sign of our faith in Him Who offered You the perfect sacrifice and gained for us eternal salvation.

Send Your Holy Spirit, the giver of life and holiness, upon us and upon these Gifts; the Bread and Wine of eternal life.


Holy Spirit come to us. Fill us with Your gift of grace.

Take these Gifts from our hands, Lord God, as an acceptable sacrifice through which we offer ourselves to You so that the Bread which we break and the Cup which we bless may be a sharing in the Body and Blood of Your Son.

Through Him, with Him, in Him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is Yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.




COMMUNION RITE



C: Let us pray together:



R: Amen.


