THE PROFESSION OF FAITH (Nicene Creed)

(please stand)

I believe in One God, the Father, the Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

I believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten not made, of one being with the Father.

Through Him all things were made. For us and for our salvation He came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit, He was born of the Virgin Mary

(here genuflect)

AND BECAME MAN

For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate; He suffered death and was buried.

On the third day He rose again in fulfillment of the Scriptures; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and His kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of Life Who proceeds from the Father. With the Father and the Son, He is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic church. I acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. I look for the resurrection of the dead and the + life of the world to come. Amen.

Celebrant: *My dear brothers and sisters, Jesus calls each of us to follow Him, to take up our cross, and to trust that the way of Christ leads us to true and everlasting life. With faith in His promise and confidence in our loving Father, let us bring before Him the needs of His Church, our world, and one another..*

L: That the Church throughout the world may courageously follow Christ, even when the road is difficult; that she may never be afraid to proclaim the Gospel, carry the burdens of those who suffer, and show the world that a life given in love is a life truly gained. Let us pray to the Lord.

R: Lord, hear our prayer.

L: For our Prime Bishop Anthony, for all bishops, priests, deacons, and for everyone who strives to bring God to others; that they may faithfully follow Christ, carry the crosses entrusted to them with courage and love, and through their words and example inspire others to become faithful disciples of Jesus. Let us pray to the Lord.

Celebrant: *Heavenly Father, Your Son Jesus taught us that whoever wishes to follow Him must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow. Give us the courage to follow Christ not only when the road is easy, but also when discipleship asks something of us. Help us to trust that no cross carried with Christ is ever carried alone, and that a life given in love is never lost. Hear the prayers we have spoken and those that remain quietly within our hearts, and grant them according to Your holy will. We ask this through Christ our Lord.*

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER IV

The Dutch Old Catholic Canon

(please kneel)

Blessed are You, Lord of all majesty and King of eternal glory through Your only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ.

In Him Your Word was made flesh. In Him the fullness of Your grace was revealed in splendor. In all things, He fulfilled Your will and glorified your name.

He proclaimed Your Kingdom to us. He broke the power of darkness over us. He took our guilt upon Himself. He reconciled us to You and unlocked the new paradise for us. As the Way, the Truth and the Life, he has revealed Your love to us. He humbled Himself and became obedient even to death on a cross, and by rising restored our life.

On the night in which He was betrayed to undergo that suffering which He Himself had chosen, He took bread into His hands and, lifting His eyes to You His heavenly Father, He gave thanks. He blessed the bread, broke it and gave it to His disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and eat it

FOR THIS IS MY BODY
WHICH IS GIVEN FOR YOU

When supper had ended, he took the cup and gave thanks to You. He blessed it, and gave it to His disciples, saying:

Take this all of you and drink from it:

FOR THIS IS THE CUP OF MY BLOOD; THE BLOOD OF THE NEW AND EVERLASTING COVENANT, WHICH SHALL BE SHED FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS.

As often as you do this, do it in remembrance of me.

Your death, Lord Jesus, we proclaim!

Your resurrection we celebrate!

Your return in glory we await!

Therefore, Father, we remember His saving Passion, His glorious Resurrection and His Exaltation at Your right hand. We await His coming in the fullness of majesty. We here set forth this sign of our faith in Him Who offered You the perfect sacrifice and gained for us eternal salvation.

Send Your Holy Spirit, the giver of life and holiness, upon us and upon these Gifts; the Bread and Wine of eternal life.

Holy Spirit come to us. Fill us with Your gift of grace.

Take these Gifts from our hands, Lord God, as an acceptable sacrifice through which we offer ourselves to You so that the Bread which we break and the Cup which we bless may be a sharing in the Body and Blood of Your Son.

May all who receive from Your heavenly altar always remain united with You, together with all Your saints and chosen ones; with the blessed and glorious Virgin Mary, the Mother of our Lord, with Your prophets and apostles, with Your martyrs and confessors and with all who stand about Your throne in praise and prayer.

Bless Your Church throughout the world. Grant it unity and peace. Renew the earth according to Your promise. Remember all peoples and grant that all nations may give You thanks, worshiping and praising Your holy name. We ask this through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord.

Through Him, with Him, in Him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is Yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

R: Amen.

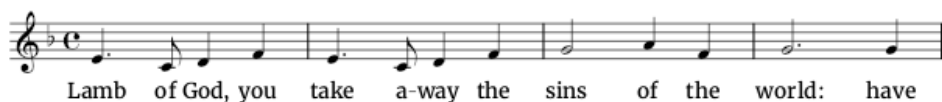
