Dear Neighbors,

At the Broomfield Community Foundation, we strive to be a voice and resource for the many needs of our neighbors in the Broomfield community and serve as a leading source of community investment and improvement. Thanks to you - our partners, donors, and volunteers, we have been able to enhance the lives of so many in the place we all call home. Here at the Foundation, we continue to evolve and adapt by working closely with our partners, building our capacity as an organization, and seeking opportunities for collaborative community involvement. We are dedicated to using our resources and working with our local nonprofits, corporate partners, and local government in Broomfield to address some of the biggest challenges facing our community. This work can only be done by connecting the generosity of donors with the power of charitable giving and grantmaking.

In these efforts, the Foundation facilitated a total of \$435,338 in grants and scholarships through January 31, 2023 (2023 grants are not reflected in audited 2022 financials found on p. 2). The funding focused on Human Services, Education, Seniors, Arts, and Civic initiatives. We have continued to build on our prior successes and now hold a broadly encompassing Humanitarian Fund designed to provide financial resources to those individuals and families displaced from their country of origin due to military conflict, natural disaster, persecution, or other qualified reasons, who have settled in Broomfield. Additionally, we continue to host the annual Volunteer Match speed-networking event, Knowledge Series sessions and Broomfield Community Service Network (BCSN) to connect and facilitate resource sharing among our local services providers. Another highlight of 2022 was the growth of our Business Impact Partners program, providing simple, streamlined and strategic alignment for effective corporate philanthropy. We sincerely thank the Foundation's Board, staff, and the tireless work of our community partners for helping us to continue making significant strides in supporting the charitable partners who operate here in our community, filling critical gaps and building a legacy for future generations.

The Refuge

Some people know The Refuge as a day shelter for unhoused people, but it is so much more. It's a safe place where individuals can come during the day and be treated with dignity. It's a café that provides free lunches as well as a spot to access free Wi-Fi, showers,

and household items. It offers help for recovering documents that are necessary for attaining housing and employment. And, The Refuge is a housing advocate that works closely with the Broomfield Community Service Network (BCSN) to help operate warming centers and provide hotel vouchers for unhoused residents in extremely cold weather.

BCF's grant to The Refuge allowed them to substantially improve their services. "The grant has been an evolution in terms of our process at The Refuge," said Marrton Dormish, minister of community outreach. "For a number of years, we operated on a shoestring budget. We were severely limited in the services and resources we were able to provide. Having funding has been an extremely helpful piece of our financial puzzle to enhance everything we do.

"The grant helped us fund our Broomfield Cares outreach van," he continued, "so we can go into the community and find people sleeping in tents or vehicles and make sure they have survival supplies and referrals to local services and agencies. Our goal is for our day shelter to expand to six or seven days per week instead of three, and include daytime and evening hours."

Marrton said, **"I believe the Broomfield Community Foundation plays a crucial role as an active community foundation in the sense they are not only raising funds and serving as caretakers for important projects, but they are also directly involved with service providers, case workers, and faith communities. I've been connected with the Foundation for more than a decade and have seen firsthand the impact of their work, their advocacy, and their overall heart for Broomfield."**

BCSN | The Broomfield Community Service Network connects nonprofits, foundations, government agencies, businesses, and religious institutions to build capacity for greater collaborative impact. Network partners gather monthly to exchange resources, workshop difficult cases, learn from thought leaders, and dismantle the silos that so frequently divide the public sector. Between meetings, partners share resources and events via a weekly e-newsletter that reaches more than 300 providers. When service providers learn of each other’s initiatives and challenges, their capacity for creative collaboration grows, and Broomfield reaps the benefit

HOW GIVING THROUGH THE FOUNDATION MULTIPLIES GENEROSITY

Cindy Combs' involvement with the Broomfield Community Foundation has deep roots and runs the gamut. She is a Donor Advised Fund holder, a Business Impact Partner, a past Board member, and has served on the Grants Committee.



Philanthropy is a core value in Cindy's family, which she wants to perpetuate for future generations, so she looked into starting a foundation. "We soon realized it wasn't financially possible," she said. "It felt like we would spend more money setting it up than giving out funds, and we didn't know how we would manage it. Once I was on the Grants Committee and the Board, I realized we had an opportunity to open a Donor Advised Fund through the Foundation, and it would be part of the grant cycle each year.

"Community investments of Donor Advised Funds are amazing, and we've been able to put more money into the grant process than we thought would be possible," she said. "Their fiduciary duties and investment plan have been very beneficial to making the most of the donations received, so we can make a larger contribution in the grant cycle." In addition, Cindy is the owner of Vista Management Associates, which participates in the Foundation's Business Impact Partner program. "Vista Management has worked in the Broomfield community since the 1990s, and this is our way to give back."



Whether donating through her family or her business, Cindy shares, **"Giving is the best part of being fortunate enough to have enough to give. It gives me joy and happiness. There's no way as an individual or business that I could touch so many lives on my own. You know your money is going to good. Just look at all of the nonprofits the Foundation supports, and it's an easy decision. That's why I like to give through the Foundation."**
