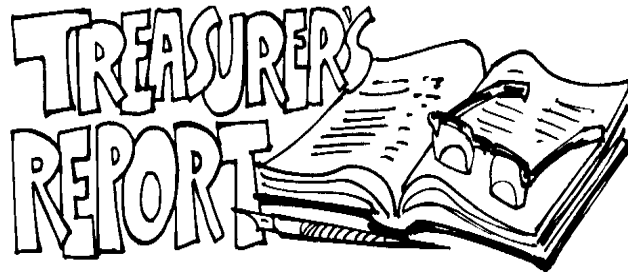

From St. Joseph's Community Food Bank

Thank you for another of your very generous donations to the Food Bank. We appreciate your continuing support. Your December donation was very timely as the Food Bank was going through the most demanding part of the year in terms of client volume. November and December are our busiest months. We typically feed an average of 274 clients per week in the other months of the year. In November, the demand rises dramatically with an average of 370 clients per week with December topping the charts at almost 650. Our volunteers are hard pressed to keep up, but the increased volumes are accompanied by an outpouring of food and cash donations.

Our donors obviously believe in supporting those who do not have enough money to feed themselves and their kids. This is reflected in the fact that we receive over 38% of our total annual revenues from generous donors in November and December. This makes it possible for us to continue buying food for all those who need it at that difficult time of the year.
