## BUSINESS



For the year-to-date to July 31st, our deficit for the year (we've spent more than we have received) has reached \$19,816. We do have funds built up in our general account from previous years to cover this deficit, and this deficit has been anticipated when we did our annual budget. The summer is always a difficult time as contributions tend to slow down, but major expenses, such as insurance, which is paid over the summer, as well as one-time projects like parking lot lights, parking pylons, and replacement of Jubilee Hall lighting.

In July, we raised \$1,000 for the organ repairs, so now we have over \$7,000 raised so far!

#### 2026 Offering Envelopes

Over the fall, we will be preparing the 2026 envelopes for distribution. May we remind you that you can be assigned a virtual envelope number in place of receiving a boxed set. This option could be considered by those who only give a few times of the year or are on PAR. Offerings can be placed in an envelope available from the church and then you place the virtual number on the envelope.
