Jose N. Treviño thanked the board for their continued support of the soccer team and encouraged them to keep supporting the program. Marta Cazares shared her experiences working at Progreso ISD and voiced a few concerns. Gabriela Acosta requested that the board remove Mr. Juan Ramos from his position as board president. Enrique Camarena expressed his gratitude to everyone involved in the 2025 graduation ceremony and inquired about the status of the UIL hearing. He also requested new desks for teachers and principals and brought up the need for new band uniforms. Evelyn Castillo, a former Progreso ISD student, spoke about her time as a DTMS student and shared her concerns regarding the board president situation. Alicia Piña informed the board and audience that in November 2023, she received a very troubling message regarding the high school soccer team. She inquired about the current status of the mariachi group and the dance team. She went on to thank Ms. Sarmiento, Mr. Agapito Perez, Mr. Jay Ramos, Ms. Berenice, and Ms. Acosta for their support and donations to the family affected. Juan Carlos Macias emphasized that all students, regardless of their background, should have equal opportunities to attend school and participate in any sport they choose. He also expressed his gratitude to Board President Mr. Jay Ramos for his significant help in securing a scholarship for his son. Board president Mr. Jay Ramos thanks the community for the support on his case and apologies to the students, staff, school, family and community for his actions. Ms. Sarmiento asked Mr. Ramos to resign from the board of trustees.

B- Superintendents Report Discussion and possible action on the following: B1 District Reports

Mr. Coronado informed the board that Thursday marked the last day of summer school and the enrichment program, which had over 130 students participating at each campus. At the elementary level, enrichment activities included folklorico, art, gaming, and athletics. He noted that 40% of the students enrolled did not require summer school but chose to participate in enrichment activities. He also shared that preparations for the upcoming golf tournament. So far, 10 companies have registered, and Mr. Agapito and Mr. Ramos have additional teams confirmed. The goal is to reach 35 teams, and he invited the community to take part. All proceeds from the tournament will go toward scholarships for graduating seniors. Mr. Coronado continued by updating the board on recruitment efforts. He stated that recruitment has begun within the Progreso community and will expand beyond city limits. He also mentioned House Bill 1481, which prohibits student cellphone use. Attorney Mr. Eden Ramirez provided clarification to the board, noting that the district will have options for how to comply with the new law. Mr. Jorge Lazaro gave an update on the track and field project. He is working with Hellas to finalize the remaining details. Although rain has caused some delays, if the weather improves, the new stadium is expected to be completed by mid-July. Additionally, Mr. Lazaro reported on the EPA grant application submitted in November. The district is seeking up to \$20 million for roof and parking lot repairs, solar panel installation, and A/C unit replacements across all district buildings. The application is progressing well, and Progreso remains a strong candidate for funding due to its location near the Mexican border. Finally, Mr. Hernandez updated the board on the fencing project, noting that it is nearly complete, with only the installation of the electrical gates remaining.

B2 Presentation by Valiant Energy Source LLC

Renewables: Facilitating the procurement of renewable energy sources, such as solar and wind power, in summary, Valiant Energy provides top-notch energy management solutions, offering client education, expert guidance, and a full range of services to ensure clients get the best value and efficiency from their energy contracts Assisted the City of Edinburg in Reverse Bidding Process: Valiant Energy stepped in to help the City of Edinburg avoid a contract gap by guiding them through the, reverse bidding process. This action prevented the city from unintentionally going out of contract, which could

have led to higher energy costs. Valiant proactively arranged an emergency meeting with city leaders to address the issue quickly and minimize potential expenses. Worked with IDEA Public Schools to identify billing anomalies: during a routine quarterly audit of IDEA Public Schools' energy bills. Valiant identified billing discrepancies. As a result, the team worked with the utility provider, AEP, to resolve the issues and secure a \$11,400 credit for IDEA Public schools. Recovered \$128,000.00 in taxes paid in error for the City of Roma: Valiant assisted the City of Roma recover over \$128,000 in taxes that had been paid in error. Additionally, Valiant managed a reverse bidding process that reduced the city's energy budget by 30% significantly lowering the costs. Assisted the City of La Joya before Winter Storm: Valiant Energy assisted the City of La Joya through a reverse bidding process just before Winter Storm Uri hit. By securing favorable energy contracts ahead of the storm, the city was able to save hundreds of thousands of dollars on energy costs. Recovered over \$40,000.00 for the Boys & Girls Club of McAllen: Valiant identified and assisted the Boys & Girls Club of McAllen to recover over \$40,000 in taxes that were paid in error. This refund allowed the club to reinvest the funds into operations, including opening a new position to further support their programs. In each case, Valiant Energy was proactive in identifying opportunities to reduce costs and recover funds, all while using their expertise to navigate complex energy markets and billing systems on behalf of their clients.

NON-DISCLOSURE AGREEMENT & ANCILLARY NON-COMPETE AGREEMENT

This Non-Disclosure Agreement and Ancillary Non-Compete Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into as of July, 2025 - June, 2026 (the "Effective Date"), by and between the party identified on the signature page as Discloser (the "Discloser") and the party identified on the signature page as Recipient (the "Recipient") (Recipient and Discloser, each a "Party" and collectively the "Parties").

WHEREAS, Discloser has certain confidential information relating to Discloser's business, which Recipient may gain access to in connection with their evaluation of a business relationship, training and/or work, and Recipient is willing to accept the other's information confidentially subject to the terms of this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. "Confidential Information" means any information furnished or disclosed, whether before or after the Effective Date in whatever form or medium, by the Discloser to the Recipient relating to the business of the Discloser and includes, without limitation, processes, website design, functionality, and data, and contracts, data, draft and final documents, compilations, specifications, strategies, policies, procedures, reports, drawings, licenses, records, projections, processes, techniques, methods, provider and payor information, deal terms, term sheets, contract terms, financial or other discoveries, information. ideas, inventions, developments, trade secrets, all tangible and intangible embodiments thereof of any kind whatsoever, and any information obtained by the Receiver through observation or examination of any of the foregoing; provided, however, Confidential Information will not include information that the Recipient can demonstrate: (a) was publicly known at the time of disclosure, or later became publicly known through no act or omission of the Recipient; (b) was rightfully received by the Recipient from a third party without any obligation of confidentiality; or (c) was independently developed by or for the Recipient without use of Discloser's Confidential Information.
- 2. The Recipient shall use Discloser's Confidential Information only for the purpose of employment with the Discloser, and shall make no use of Discloser's Confidential Information, in whole or in part, for any other purposes. The Recipient agrees to keep confidential all of Discloser's Confidential Information and to take all reasonable steps to preserve the confidential and proprietary nature of such Confidential Information. Recipient shall not disclose any of Discloser's Confidential Information including, without limitation, to any affiliate; provided, however, that Recipient may disclose Confidential Information only on a need-to-know basis, as reasonably necessary for employment with Discloser.
- 3. In the event that the Recipient is requested or required by subpoena or other court order to

- disclose any of Discloser's Confidential Information. the Recipient will provide immediate notice of such request to the Discloser and will use reasonable efforts to resist disclosure, until an appropriate protective order may be sought, or a waiver of compliance with the provisions of this Agreement granted. If, in the absence of a protective order or the receipt of a waiver hereunder, the Recipient is nonetheless, in the written opinion of its counsel, legally required to disclose Discloser's Confidential Information, then, in such event, the Recipient may disclose such information without liability hereunder, provided that the Discloser has been given a reasonable opportunity to review the text of such disclosure before it is made and that the disclosure is limited to only the Confidential Information specifically required to be disclosed pursuant to the written opinion of Recipient's counsel.
- 4. The Discloser may elect at any time to terminate further access to its Confidential Information. Upon written request, the Recipient will return to the Discloser all Confidential Information in any form and promptly destroy any and all material or information derived from the Confidential Information, including any copies or extracts.
- 5. Nothing contained in this Agreement will be construed as granting or conferring any rights by license or otherwise, express or implied, or otherwise for any patents, copyrights, trademarks, know-how or other proprietary rights of either Party acquired prior to or after the date of this Agreement.
- 6. Regardless of the termination of any business relationship between the Parties, this Agreement and the obligations of confidentiality and nondisclosure contained herein will remain in full force and effect during any discussions between Recipient and Discloser and (a) indefinitely thereafter with respect to trade secrets and (b) for five (5) years thereafter for all other Confidential Information.
- 7. The Confidential Information protected by this Agreement is of a special character, such that money damages would not be sufficient to award or
