

High Quality Prekindergarten Family Engagement Plan

"The mutual responsibility of families, schools and communities to build relationships to support student learning and achievement, support family well-being and the continuous learning and development of children, families, and educators. Family engagement is fully integrated in the child's educational experience and is both culturally and linguistically appropriate."

Texas Administrative Code §102.1003

According to the Texas Education Agency, the goal of the High Quality Prekindergarten Program is to "provide districts with an opportunity to expand or enhance high quality prekindergarten programs for qualifying students." TEA identifies six family engagement components which must be incorporated into the local family engagement plan.

- 1. Facilitate family-to-family support
- 2. Establish a network of community resources
- 3. Increase family participation in decision-making
- 4. Equip families with tools to enhance and extend learning
- 5. Develop staff skills in evidence-based practices that support families in meeting their child's learning benchmarks
- 6. Evaluate family engagement efforts and use evaluation for continuous improvement

Progreso ISD, in accordance with the House Bill 3 High-Quality Prekindergarten guidelines, have established a High-Quality Prekindergarten Family Engagement Plan to promote and encourage a positive partnership between our school, families, and the community to ensure the six family engagement components outlined by TEA are systematically implemented and sustained.

Progreso Early Childhood believes in the importance of school-home communication and values the parent/guardian relationship as the foundation of a successful learning experience for the child. Our goal is to prepare students to enter kindergarten with the academic and social/emotional skills necessary to be successful in school and life. We know this is best accomplished within the early childhood setting by providing a safe & engaging learning environment that considers the developmental needs and interests of each child while simultaneously fostering positive school-home collaboration.
