As a living history museum, Pioneer Park gives students a hands-on experience of the daily lives of early settlers in Alabama. Students can see Creek Indian structures and learn about the area's earliest inhabitants, walk through time-period gardens and heritage crops, visit blacksmiths who made frontier life possible, watch demonstrations of early tools and machinery, and explore a one-room cabin and a one-room school. It's a day that brings history to life.
