[] Look for brittle, dead, or leafless branches.
[] Check for leaning trees - especially recent or worsening tilts.
[] Inspect trunks for cracks, splits, or bark separation.
[] Look for mushrooms or fungal growth at the base.
[] Check for pest signs like boreholes or sawdust.
[] Notice thinning canopy or excessive deadwood.
Location-Specific Risk Factors
[] Inspect branches hanging over your home or power lines.
[] Note low-hanging limbs obstructing walkways or driveways.
[] Check for soil erosion or pooling water near tree bases.
Know Your Tree Types
[] Identify native species like Mesquite, Cedar Elm, Yaupon Holly.
[] Avoid pruning oak trees during oak wilt season (spring/early summer).
