Young people in Jefferson County sit at a critical intersection of vulnerability and possibility. For youth and young adults navigating housing instability, mental health challenges, disconnection from education or work, or the long shadow of systems not built for them, prevention isn't a catchphrase, it is the difference between momentum and crisis.

At OWL360, we invest early, intentionally, and relationally. We believe the strongest outcomes happen when young people are met before they fall through the cracks, not after. Stable housing, trusted adults, accessible mental health support, and real pathways to education and employment are not luxuries; they are the infrastructure of a healthy community.

Our work is deeply rooted in partnership. We don't operate in isolation, and we don't pretend to have all the answers. Progress happens because of strong collaboration with schools, healthcare providers, workforce partners, housing agencies, local government, grassroots organizations, and our community who share a commitment to youth well-being. These relationships allow us to move faster, respond smarter, and stay accountable to the young people we serve.

Just as important is trust. OWL360 exists because young people walk through our doors and believe they will be seen, respected, and supported without judgment. That trust is built day by day through consistency, transparency, and showing up when it matters.



OWL360's housing program is more than a place to stay; it's a launchpad. We serve young people ages 17–25 who are unhoused, at imminent risk of homelessness, or escaping unsafe environments. Through stable housing and intentional, wraparound support, we help young people in Jefferson County regain their footing, build real-world skills, and move decisively toward long-term stability and independence.



## Casey's journey from being unsheltered to self-sufficient. A powerful reminder of how community support can transform a young life.

Casey hasn't always known where she would sleep for the night. At age 17, she moved out of an unsafe home and found herself either sleeping in her car or couch surfing. As Casey says, **"then I was given the opportunity to live in housing run by OWL360. Everything changed. For the first time, I had a safe space of my own, a place where I could blossom, focus, and work hard toward my goals."**

With the safety net of OWL360, Casey was able to participate in the Earn to Learn program, which led to into a paid internship with the Port Townsend Film Festival. Casey participated in the OWL360 Clemente Course and fell head over heels with arts and humanities. She never imagined she was smart enough to go to college. Today Casey has her eyes set on a bachelor's degree at her dream school. Casey says "OWL360 took me under their wing. They gave me the time, space, and resources to rebuild myself and my life. Because of them, I've been able to create a stable and beautiful future."

# Workforce Development



## Career Pathways for Young People

Many young people in Jefferson County face notable challenges to entering the workforce and achieving economic self-reliance. Without connections, resources, and community support systems, they struggle to identify career pathways, access meaningful work, and build the skills necessary for long-term success. OWL360's career pathways are designed to be gateways to solid footing.

## EARN TO LEARN **20** PROGRAM GRADUATES

A program where local students earn a \$500 stipend to support themselves while learning the skills they need to find, land, and excel at a job that interests them.

## LEVEL UP **17** ENTERED INTO INTERNSHIPS & VOCATIONAL TRAINING

A paid internship program where *Earn to Learn* graduates embark on their career with paid internships and pathways into vocational training. Interns receive a \$1,000 stipend after successful completion of a 90-hour internship.




Young people can access supportive services and connections with staff who are trained in youth mental health first aid. They offer a listening ear, and compassionate responses while walking alongside a young person.




# Financials
