Important Facts About the Meet

- Entry Deadline:
 - December 1, 2025, at 3:00 pm EST.
 - All paperwork and entry fees must be brought to the meet
- Time Standards There are no minimum Time Standards for this meet.
- Entry times shall be in short course yards (Y) achieved since January 1, 2024. No Converted Times will be accepted. **No "NT's" will be** accepted. Please estimate times.
- There are no entry limits.
- All events will be swum fastest to slowest, combining genders.
- The nature of this meet is a virtual challenge that will be contested in each of the six (6) commissions on various dates. Each of the meets from the six (6) commissions will then be combined into a single meet and scored. Should an athlete choose to participate in more than one commission, their fastest time will be used when combining and scoring.
- If the Virtual Distance meet is being conducted on the same day as another meet, per USA Swimming Rules 102.2, the swimmer may compete in not more than six (6) individual events per day inclusive of all meets.
- Athletes from outside the Ohio LSC are invited to attend; however, they will <u>not</u> be eligible for OSI Virtual Distance Awards. They are
 eligible for any local awards the meet host chooses to distribute.
- Each participating athlete will be required to provide at least one (1) timer and a counter (if desired). Parents will be allowed on deck to time and/or count for their athlete(s).

USA Swimming Rules	At a sanctioned competitive event, all USA Swimming athletes must be under the supervision of a USA Swimming member coach. Arrangements for coach supervision must be made in advance of the meet.					
	 Any swimmer entered in the meet <u>must</u> be certified by a USA Swimming member-coach as being proficient in performing a racing start or must start each race from within the water without the use of the backstroke ledge. When unaccompanied by a member-coach, it is the responsibility of the swimmer or the swimmer's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement. 					
	The use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms.					
	 Use of cameras, cell phones or any other recording device is not permitted immediately behind the starting blocks at either end of the racing course(s) during race starts, competition and warm-ups. Please refer to the Safe Sport section of the Ohio Swimming, Inc. policies and procedures for further information regarding the use of visual recording devices. 					
	Deck changes are prohibited.					
	 Operation of a drone, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas and open ceiling locker rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present. 					
	Flash photography is not permitted at the start of any race.					
	 All applicable adults participating in or associated with this meet acknowledge that they are subject to the provisions of the USA Swimming Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy (MAAPP) and that they understand that compliance with the MAAPP policy is a condition of participation in the conduct of this competition. 					
Safe Sport 360	 The U.S. Center for Safe Sport program is a comprehensive abuse prevention program dedicated to creating a healthy and positive environment free from abuse for all its members. Components of the program include, but are not limited to, providing education and training, enforcing policies (such as the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy), rules and best practice guidelines, promoting healthy boundaries and mandatory reporting of violations.

Times achieved by an athlete who turns age 18 on or after the first day of competition, who competes in this USA Swimming sanctioned event without completing this membership requirement, will NOT count for qualification or recognition. Entering the Meet				
Eligibility:	 All contestants must be verified USA Swimming members. Membership will not be verified at the meet. Membership verification deadline is 5 PM EST one (1) business day prior to the first day of the meet. Unverified swimmers will be scratched from the meet after that deadline. There will be no refunds for unverified swimmers scratched from the meet. All adult athletes must hold current Athlete Protection Training certification. Age on the first day of the meet will determine age for the entire meet. 			
Entry Procedure for Swimmers with a Disability	 Entry Procedures: Enter the USA-S swimmers with a disability electronically via email to the entry chair. Provide the grouping the swimmer is identified under (P1, P2, P3) and any necessary accommodations. List in the email with the electronic entry (or on the paper entry) the swimmer's name, entry times, based on grouping (P1, P2, P3) strokes/distances and days/sessions. Please inform the Meet Referee of any swimmers needing additional accommodations prior to the start of the meet. Para-Grouping Descriptions are listed in the OSI Policies and Procedures document posted on the Ohio Swimming website under Governance>OSI Policies & Procedures. 			

Entering the Meet	
Entry Fees:	 \$10 per individual event. \$4 OH LSC surcharge per swimmer. \$10.00 Facility Fee
Entry Procedures:	 Deadline for receipt of entries is December 1, 2025 Entries must be submitted in SCY using an electronic meet entry software (Hy-Tek/Team Unify). Unattached swimmers (not with a team) are encouraged to use Hytek's TM Lite for entry submission. Entries not completed through a team software are subject to a \$50/swimmer surcharge. These fees are due at the time of the entry submission. Send entries via email to: kristina0972@hotmail.com Please include the names of any Outreach swimmers in the email. Checks should be made payable to: Westerville Aquatic Club "No Time" (NT) entries will NOT be accepted. If a swimmer wants an official intermediate split from an individual longer distance event, they must notify the meet referee before the event and complete an Ohio Time Certification form.
Deck Entries	Deck Entries will not be accepted.
Warm-up and Safety Guidelines:	 The meet host will provide a complete schedule of warm-up procedures to include lane assignments and times, which must be adhered to by all participants. This information will be distributed at registration, posted throughout the venue, announced on a regular basis before and during the meet, and monitored jointly by the Meet Director and Meet Referee (or their special designees). Flagrant violation of these procedures may result in a disqualification from the meet for unsportsmanlike activity. Encourage your swimmers to cooperate with marshals. Warm-up procedures may, at the discretion of the host team, be modified based on the number of swimmers in the meet and other safety and logistical concerns.
Competition Guidelines:	 This meet will be a timed finals meet. This meet will be contested in SCY. No Clerk of Course will be available for younger swimmers. Events will be contested as combined gender events. Heats will be swum fastest to slowest. Warmup-Start times will be published after the entry deadline. 6 lanes will be used for competition.
Awards:	 After all virtual meets have been contested, the results will be compiled and posted on the OSI website. Medals will be awarded for the top three (3) finishers in each age group (8 & under, 9-10, 11-12, 13-14, and 15 & over) Only athletes registered in the Ohio Swimming LSC will receive OSI awards. Awards will be given at the next OSI Banquet.
Scoring	This meet will NOT be scored
General:	Heat sheets will be available to coaches and officials at the meet. All participating teams will receive electronic copies that may be distributed to parents.
