JANUARY IS NATIONAL BOOK MONTH!

BET YOU DIDN'T KNOW...SHERLOCK'S ICONIC HAT IS NEVER MENTIONED IN DOYLE'S STORIES

The classic image of Sherlock Holmes almost always depicts him as wearing a deerstalker cap. Doyle, however, never explicitly mentions the deerstalker at any point in the entire Holmes canon.

The distinctive hunting cap only became associated with Holmes through the illustrations of Sidney Paget, who drew the detective in 38 stories for The Strand Magazine between 1891 and 1908. Paget first portrayed Holmes



with a deerstalker — a hat normally associated with hunting and shooting in rural areas — in an October 1891 story called The Boscombe Valley Mystery, because the story takes place in the countryside. The image stuck, and the hat became part of Holmes' signature look in all his future mysteries.



- 3 potatoes, medium, diced 3 small onions, sliced 3 stalks celery, diced
- 1 (16 ounce) can tomatoes • 1/3 cup small shell pasta Salt and pepper

- Melt butter, add beef and cook slightly, stirring with fork

WINTER CAR TIPS

HELP PREPARE YOUR CAR FOR WINTER WITH THESE HELPFUL TIPS.

Whether you live in the cold Midwest or a less frigid southern part of the country, it pays to prepare your car before the first storm of the season. Consider checking or talking to your mechanic about the following:

- 1. Test the battery strength.
- 2. Inspect the exhaust system and the air, fuel and emission fil ers.
- 3. Check the heating and cooling system, windshield wiper and antifreeze fluid le els, and change the oil.
- 4. Check both the front window and rear window defrosters.
- 5. See that hoses, fan belts and all components are working properly.
- 6. Consider changing the spark plugs.
- 7. Each week, check the tire pressure and tread life. And consider installing winter tires, as they're made to give you better traction on cold pavement.
- 8. Locate the spare tire, jack and ice scraper.
- 9. Check both the front and rear lights. The front lights should provide the brightest illumination possible. Replace any burned out bulbs.
- 10. Inspect your wiper blades to see that they're functional and in good condition.

All drivers should think about using extra caution when driving in winter conditions. Slow down and allow additional time to get to your destination.
