Chestnut Class threw themselves into their team games with great seriousness and concentration. Walking with a bean bag on your head, and not holding onto it, takes some skill!



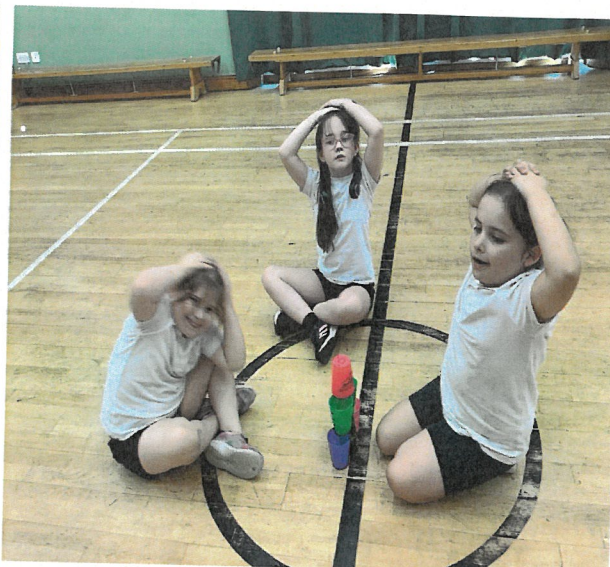
The children had to channel the same skills as they navigated the egg and spoon race. There might have been a small amount of help to keep the egg on the spoons!
