Menu Addition





ENGINEERING CHALLENGE 13

Designed by Sam, Teacher and Design and Technology enthusiast at Malmesbury Primary School

The brief

Create a water clock that times exactly one minute with 200ml of water.

The method

- A simple water clock could consist of two plastic cups fixed one above the other with a hole in the top cup to allow water to pass from one to the other.
- Additional cups, string, straws, plasticine, etc. can also be used to create more elaborate examples or to help slow the water if necessary.

Top tip

You will need to use a timer to observe and measure time accurately and make changes depending on your results. The size and position of the holes, the number of cups the water passes through, the angle of straws and flow rates will all affect your design.

Materials

Plastic cups
Straws
Plasticine
String
A timer
Wooden doweling or similar to act as a stand
Scissors
(with adult supervision)
Tape

Drawing pins

Water clocks are among the most ancient of time pieces, with known examples from Egypt dating to the 16th Century BC. Examples with gears and feedback systems were developed during the Greek and Roman periods.







Visit To Williams FI HQ

This week the winners of the STEM competition attended their prize trip.

After a very early start, the children arrived at Willimas F1 Racing HQ at 9am. In the morning, the children had an informative tour of the Williams Racing Museum and looked at cars from the 1970's all the way to modern day, including cars driven by Nigel Mansell, Ayrton Senna and George Russell! The collective cost of the cars in the museum is over £300 million. We got to hold the steering wheel used by George Russell and a helmet worn by Alex Albon.





Regulations and the safety evolution of the cars fascinated the children. Our guide, Matt, told the children about the 1,000s of job roles needed in STEM to make one component like the steering wheel. They learnt about the use of carbon fiber and held a wing worth over £100,000.

The children raced each other on real e-sports simulators using real F1 wheels. The brakes alone were as heavy as 30kg to push. In a real F1 car, pushing the brake needs over 100kg of force. They raced on famous circuits like Baku, Silverstone, Monaco and more. We did have a couple of crashes of course.

Year 5 and above - Saxophone




Beginner lessons are £6.75 per week payable in a 10 week block for £67.50.



Do you qualify for FREE SCHOOL MEALS?

Reasons to apply

Even if your child is currently receiving free school meals because they are in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, you should still apply for benefits-related FSM if you think you may be eligible.



Doing so means that our school will be given extra funding for six years, which can help to fund valuable teaching and learning support for the school.

Applying for benefits-related FSM also means you will be eligible to receive funding for the holiday periods from the Warwickshire Local Welfare Scheme.






I am delighted to inform you that following the success of last terms course we are expanding the football coaching programme for the season. The new course will start on Thursday 18th September and run on a weekly basis for the duration of the school term (10-14 weeks).



Can I apply?

Your child could be eligible for free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support or Jobseeker's
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support from National **Asylum Support Service** (NASS)
- Guarantee Pension Credit
- · Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- · Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
