






We have received a thank you note from our local Food Bank for your wonderful harvest donation which totalled **310** kilos.

Science Challenge





#### You'll need

Bin bag/plastic sheet/paper or other flat material.

4 pieces of string sellotape or masking tape 2 eggs ( boiled or chocolate )



#### Instructions

Lay the bin bag out flat and cut out a large square.

Make a hole in each corner, thread a piece of string though the hole and tie a knot.

Tie all 4 pieces of string together and sellotape the egg to the bottom

#### **Extension Ideas**

Create a basket for the egg to sit in.

Experiment with different materials for the parachute.

Try dropping the parachute from different heights.

A egg dropped without anything to slow it down will fall fast and smash. The parachute adds air resistance which slows the fall of the egg, hopefully stopping it from breaking as it hits the ground.



#### Do you qualify for FREE SCHOOL MEALS?

#### **Reasons to apply**

Even if your child is currently receiving free school meals because they are in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, you should still apply for benefits-related FSM if you think you may be eligible.



Doing so means that our school will be given extra funding for six years, which can help to fund valuable teaching and learning support for the school. Applying for benefits-related FSM also means you will be eligible to receive funding for the holiday periods from the Warwickshire Local Welfare Scheme.

#### Can I apply?

Your child could be eligible for free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support or Jobseeker's
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support from National **Asylum Support Service** (NASS)
- Guarantee Pension Credit
- · Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- · Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
