Achievement Award Assemblies – A New Monthly Approach

A letter has gone out to you all this week to inform you of the exciting changes to our Achievement Award Assemblies to further promote our Effective Learning Behaviours.



Rather than holding weekly assemblies, each month we will focus on a specific Effective Learning Behaviour, introduced during an assembly on the first Monday of the month. Throughout the month, staff will recognise children who demonstrate this behaviour particularly well, as well as those who show other exceptional achievements or positive learning behaviours.

On the last Monday of each month, at least four children from every class will be selected to receive a certificate of achievement. Their parents/carers will be invited to join us for a special Achievement Award Assembly. Only children selected for an award will attend the assembly, making the occasion even more special.

We hope this new approach will help children develop a stronger understanding of effective learning behaviours and provide an even greater incentive to demonstrate these behaviours consistently.



Please Remember to Label School Uniform

A little reminder to all parents and carers about the importance of labelling every item of your child's school uniform

Already this term, we have had a number of items handed in as lost property which will be very difficult to return to their owners because they do not have a name in them. With so many children wearing similar uniform, it is almost impossible for us to identify who an item belongs to if it isn't labelled



Please take a few minutes to check that all uniform, coats, jumpers, PE kits, shoes and other personal belongings have your child's name clearly marked inside. This is particularly important for items that children regularly take on and off during the school day.

A named item can be returned quickly and easily – an unnamed item may remain in lost property! As the term progresses this often results in piles of clothes we can't store or send to charity. Lost property is far from ideal for parents having to replace items, for the school or the environment.

Thank you for helping us to keep lost property to a minimum and ensuring that belongings find their way back home.

Important Changes to Free School Meal Entitlements

We urge all parents in receipt of Universal Credit to apply for your new expanded entitlement to Free School Meals. Your child's entitlement is not automatic without you applying - don't miss out!

If your child has been in receipt of Free School Meals in the past, you will also now need to reapply to check your eligibility. This again is not automatic and many of you may find your child's free entitlement has currently ceased.

Only in circumstances where a household is on Universal Credit and has an annual income of £7,400 or less will school receive any additional funding (known as Pupil Premium funding) to support children's learning. As it stands, our school has lost a considerable level of funding (nearly half!) due to these changes. By checking your eligibility, you will be supporting us to access as much funding as possible to help maintain the educational provision we currently offer your children.

We advise all parents to ensure they have completed this check for Free School Meal eligibility by **Friday 25th September 2026.**

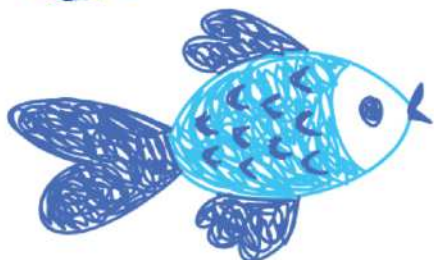

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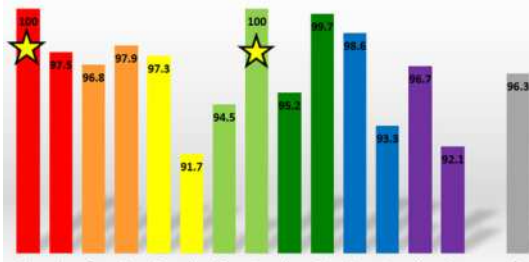

You should still apply if your child is aged 4-7 and receives a Universal Free School Meal

There have been changes to Free School Meal Entitlements

Due to the update to the national free school meals rules set by the Department for Education, some children may no longer be entitled to Free School Meals. This is because the eligibility is now based on a household's **CURRENT** circumstances.

However, under the new arrangements, eligibility is also assessed on whether you are receiving **Universal Credit**.

We would ask everyone who is receiving **Universal Credit** and/or has an annual household income of £7,400 or less to apply now for Free School Meals. This applies to ALL year groups, even if your child is in Reception to Year 2 and receives Universal Free School Meals.

It is very easy to apply, just follow this link:

warwickshire.gov.uk/education-learning/apply-free-school-meals

If you already have one child at school in receipt of Free School Meals, you will need to apply for each subsequent sibling that joins the school. It does not automatically carry over to them.

Don't miss out on support you may be entitled to.

If you'd like to opt in and have not already done so, simply register your child at www.coolmilk.com/parents. Your child(ren) will continue to receive free milk whilst under the age of 5 and Cool Milk will get in touch with further information by email shortly before their 5th birthday.

For children who are already over 5, it's not too late – our scheme is flexible! As well as being able to register and make payment straight away, you can join and cancel the scheme at any time. We offer yearly, termly and half termly payment periods and a recurring payment option to give you one less thing to remember.

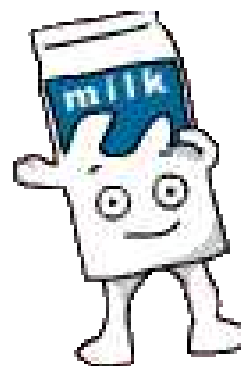

FREE SCHOOL MEALS



School meals are free for lots of families, check if you are eligible to apply!

So much more than lunch...

A free school meal:

- creates healthy eating habits
- improves learning and behaviour
- saves money and time
- helps schools get extra funding

Did you know that claiming free school meals means that your child may get access to free school holiday activities and food?

Can I apply?

Your child could be eligible for free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Universal Credit
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- guarantee element of Pension Credit

You should still apply if your child is aged 4-7 and receives a universal free school meal

Some families who have no recourse to public funds are also eligible for free school meals, please see the webpages below for more details.

Depending on the benefits you receive and your level of income, your child may also get access to the Holiday Activities and Food programme and their school could receive extra funding for them. Find out more and apply at: www.warwickshire.gov.uk/fsm
