Home Reading - Boom Read

A reminder that regular reading at home makes a significant difference to children's confidence, vocabulary, fluency and progress across the curriculum. We expect all children to read at home regularly, with a minimum of once a week, and for parents and carers to record each reading session on the Boom Read App.



The start of a new school year is the perfect time to establish positive reading habits. Whether your child reads independently, reads aloud to an adult, shares a book with you or listens to you reading, please make reading a regular and enjoyable part of your home routine.

Our BoomReadathon is also underway this month, encouraging children to build the habit of reading and recording their reading at home. Children are working towards individual and class totals, with prizes to be won.

Please make reading a priority at home this year. Read regularly with your child and remember to record every reading session on Boom Read. Your support and consistency really can make a lasting difference to your child's reading confidence, enjoyment and achievement.

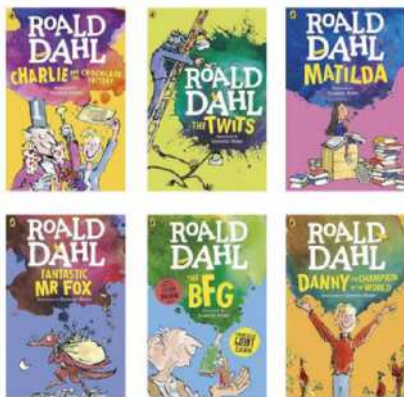

From The Enormous Crocodile and The Twits to George's Marvellous Medicine, Danny, the Champion of the World and Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, there was plenty of fun and enthusiasm throughout the school.

It was lovely to see children enjoying Roald Dahl's stories and celebrating the magic of reading together.

Attendance Matters

Every school day counts!

Regular attendance is a national priority, and the government expects schools, families and local authorities to work together to ensure children attend school regularly.

For children of compulsory school age, parents and carers have a legal responsibility to ensure their child receives a full-time education. This means attending school every day unless there is an authorised reason for absence, such as illness.



The national ambition is to improve attendance and return rates to the levels seen before the pandemic, with attendance of over 95%. At Whitnash Primary, we monitor attendance carefully and work closely with families where attendance begins to cause concern. Equally, if parents wish to discuss any concern about their child/ren's attendance then please contact us.

It is particularly important to act early. A child who misses 10% or more of their school sessions is classed as a persistent absentee. This equates to missing around one day every two weeks and can have a significant impact on learning, progress and friendships.

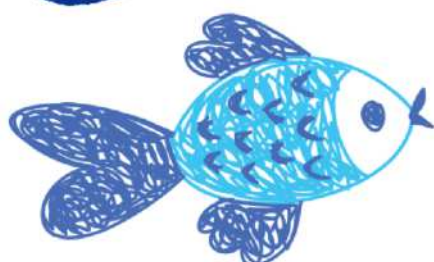

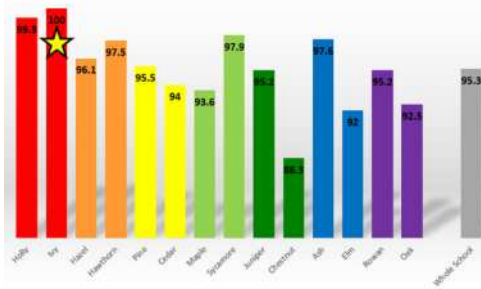

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

You should still apply if your child is aged 4-7 and receives a Universal Free School Meal

There have been changes to Free School Meal Entitlements

Due to the update to the national free school meals rules set by the Department for Education, some children may no longer be entitled to Free School Meals. This is because the eligibility is now based on a household's **CURRENT** circumstances.

However, under the new arrangements, eligibility is also assessed on whether you are receiving **Universal Credit**.

We would ask everyone who is receiving **Universal Credit** and/or has an annual household income of £7,400 or less to apply now for Free School Meals. This applies to ALL year groups, even if your child is in Reception to Year 2 and receives Universal Free School Meals.

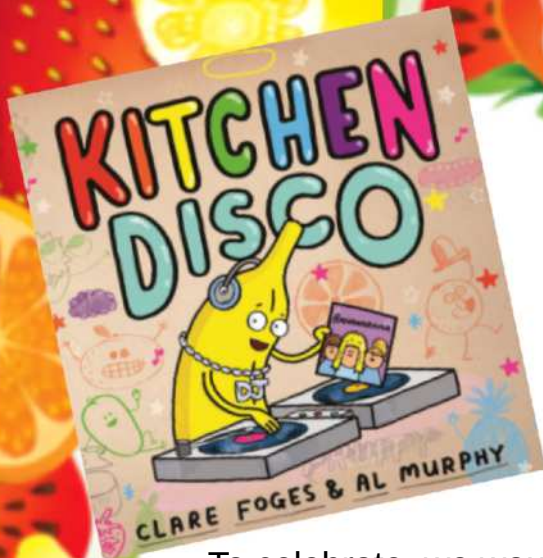

If you already have one child at school in receipt of Free School Meals, you will need to apply for each subsequent sibling that joins the school. It does not automatically carry over to them.

If your child has any **fruit allergies** that you have not already informed us about, please let a member of the Reception team know as soon as possible.

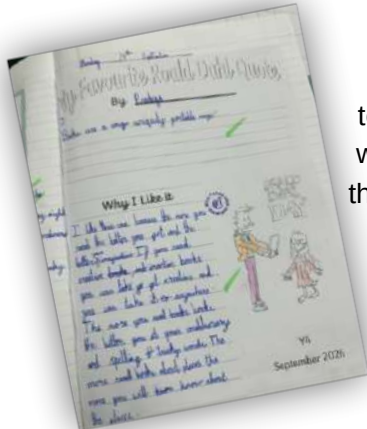

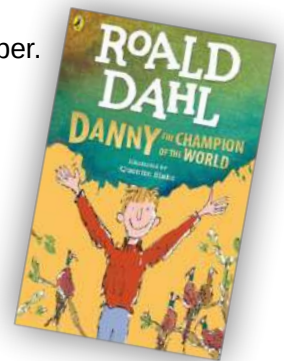


ROALD DAHL DAY

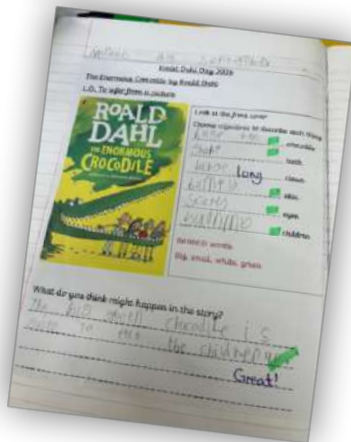
Whitnash Primary celebrated Roald Dahl Story day on Monday 14th September.
Here are some of the things we got up to!



Year 6 have focused on **Danny Champion of the World**. They took part in some retrieval and inference tasks, including drawing what they think Danny's caravan looks like from the description in the text. After reading some more chapters of the book, some Year 6 children replied to their teacher's log on Boom Reader about what impression they got of Danny.



Year 4 thought about all of the amazing quotes that are inspiring from a range of Roald Dahl books. They chose their favourite quotes and explained the reasons for their choices.



Year 3 enjoyed finding out more about **Mr Twit** and his disgusting beard! They had fun thinking about all the disgusting things that might be hidden inside it and after drawing it, wrote a piece of descriptive writing that would make your stomach churn!

Year 2 used the front cover to choose adjectives that described the **Enormous Crocodile**. They looked very carefully and chose appropriate adjectives to describe the different parts. They also wrote a prediction about what they thought was going to happen.



Year 3 were also employed briefly in **Willie Wonka's Chocolate Factory** Sweet Testing Lab where Willie Wonka set them 4 questions. They had to use their Scientific skills to discover the answers. They had lots of fun testing and finding out the answers and recognising that Scientists answer questions in different ways. Why not ask your child what they found out? (and if Wonka let them test any of his products!)

- Which sweet can Wonka make a floating boat out of?
- What temperature water changes the water colour the most?
- Which chocolate (white, milk or dark) will melt the quickest to make his chocolate river?
- Which sweets will change in water? How do they change?

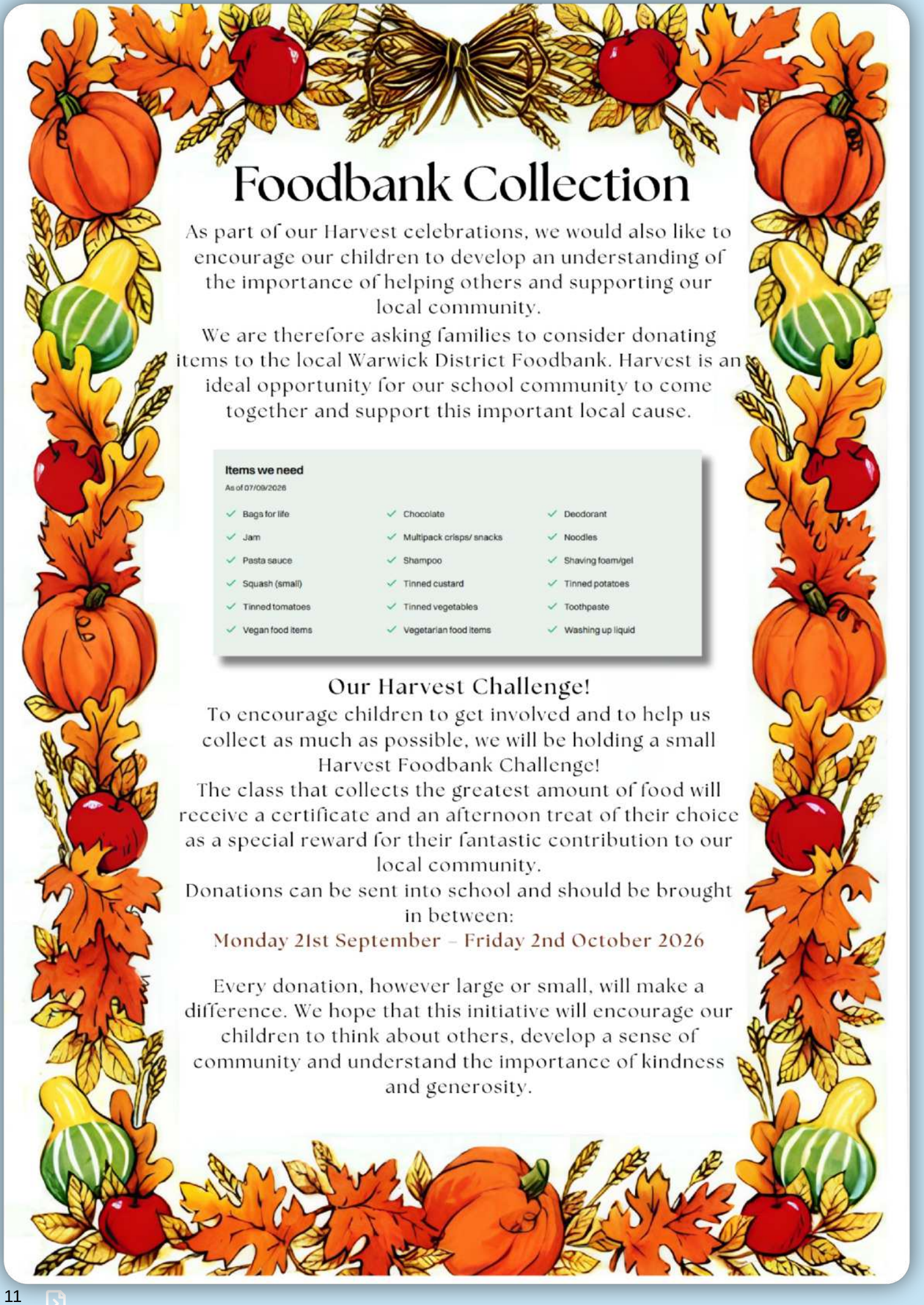

We offer yearly, termly and half termly payment periods and a recurring payment option to give you one less thing to remember.

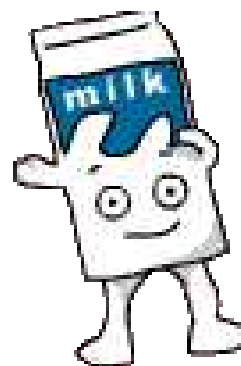

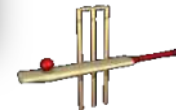

Some families who have no recourse to public funds are also eligible for free school meals, please see the webpages below for more details.
