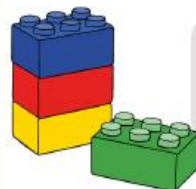

Reading and phonics

We have a daily 'Read, Write, Inc' phonics session where we learn new letter sounds, practise forming letters correctly, and learn to read and spell simple words.

Every day we choose a different story from our reading corner for 'snack and story time'. This time is to encourage children's interest in reading alongside opportunities for comprehension and inference questions about the story.

Children will be focusing on the enquiry question of how might your religion or world view be seen in the choices you make?

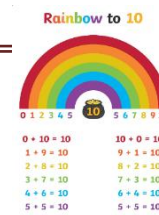
Music

Children will be learning following music using glockenspiels.

Mathematics

This term we are exploring:

Key focus: Developing our understanding of addition and subtraction using the part-whole model and learning number bonds to 5 and 10. We will be using a range of practical resources before learning how to record number sentences using the correct symbols.



Science

Children will be continuing their yearly topic of exploring the seasons. This term focusing on Autumn and Winter.

They will also be focusing on animals including humans. Children will be learning about a variety of different animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. They will learn that animals are carnivores, herbivores or omnivores. At the end of this unit children will know different features of a variety of common animals and be able to identify them.

English

In our English lessons we will be learning how to write a familiar story:

- Writing a sentence by saying out loud what I am going to write
- Reading my sentences and checking they make sense
- Breaking down spoken words into sounds to spell words correctly
- Using finger spaces, capital letters and full stops
- Using 'and'
- Adding suffixes -ed, -ing and est.

The story we are focusing our learning on this term is 'The jolly postman'
