<u>English</u> Write your own poem about the Stone Age. This could be a rhyming poem, an acrostic poem or a shape poem!	<u>Maths</u> Write 3 word problems for addition and subtraction. e.g. if Claire has 42 muffins and she eats 6, how many does she have left?	<u>History/DT</u> Design and create your own Stone Age stew. Write the instructions and take a picture to show us!
<u>History</u> Draw an archaeologist. Label the key features of their job. Extra points for finding out about any famous archaeologists!	<u>Science</u> Draw and label a human or animal skeleton.	<u>Art</u> Some Stone Age paintings showed images of animals. Can you create a Stone Age painting of what animals you may have seen on the walls?
<u>Geography</u> Label 5 cities on a map of the UK. Ext: Can you find any information about these cities?	<u>DT</u> Create and evaluate a Stone Age tool.	<u>French</u> Create a poster in French to show your French learning on numbers 1 to 10, colours and greetings.
