Writing tasks (English/History/Geography Links)	STEM Tasks (Maths/Science/DT Links)	Social & Creative tasks (Art, Music, RE, PSHE, PE links)
Write a fact sheet on the Anglo-Saxons and try to include relative clauses to add extra information!	What is an angle? Go and find out what an angle is and if there are names for the degrees of the angle. Display your findings in a poster.	Draw an Anglo-Saxon settlement and try to label it with key features!
Write a recount of our Anglo-Saxon day in school. Remember to use fronted adverbials and paragraphs.	Create a bridge structure out of recycled materials at home, try to use diagonal struts to make the bridge strong and stable.	Create an exercise plan and record your progress as a diary. This could be running in your garden or at the park, maybe a fitness circuit or how long you can hold a plank.
Write a poem about the Anglo-Saxons. It can be acrostic, a kenning or a free verse!	Create a table of actions which show if a force is push or pull. For example hitting a tennis ball with a racket is a push motion.	Create a painting or drawing of an Anglo-Saxon Soldier.
