MESSAGE: KING MELCHIZEDEK (PART 4-KINGDOM SERIES)

Key Scripture: Genesis 14:17-20

1. Melchizedek: King and Priest

- **Psalm 110:1-4; Genesis 14:18-19; Isaiah 9:6-7; Hebrews 4:14-16/5:10/7:1-2; Ephesians 2:4; 1 Corinthians 1:30**
- Melchizedek was both a king and a priest, pointing to Jesus Christ.
- As King, He reigns in righteousness and peace.
- As Priest, He represents us before God and provides access to His grace.

2. The Reign of the King

- **Psalm 110:1-2/2:1-12; Revelation 19:15-16**
- Jesus is the exalted King who rules over all nations.
- His kingdom is everlasting, and every authority will ultimately submit to Him.

3. Communion and Christ's Victory

- **Genesis 14:18-20; 1 Corinthians 10:16/11:26; Colossians 2:14-15; Galatians 3:13-14**
- Melchizedek brought bread and wine to Abraham, foreshadowing the Lord's Supper.
- Communion reminds believers of Christ's sacrifice, redemption, and victory over sin and Satan.

4. The King's Communion Table

- **2 Samuel 9:1-7,13; 1 Corinthians 11:26; Psalm 23:6; Revelation 19:6-9; 1 John 3:2-3**
- Like Mephibosheth invited to David's table, believers are welcomed by grace to the King's table.
- Communion points to our fellowship with Christ now and the future marriage supper of the Lamb.

5. Communion in the Kingdom

- **Luke 22:16,18/13:29-30/14:15,23; Isaiah 25:6-8; Revelation 19:6-9**
- Jesus promised a future feast in His kingdom.
- Believers look forward to gathering with the redeemed in God's eternal kingdom.

6. Till He Comes

- **1 Corinthians 11:26; Hebrews 9:27-28; Titus 2:13; 1 John 3:2**
- Every celebration of Communion proclaims the Lord's death until He returns.
- Christians live in hopeful expectation of Christ's glorious appearing.
