

SERMON NOTES

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MESSAGE: SHILOH

Key Scripture: *“The scepter [of royalty] shall not depart from Judah, Nor the ruler’s staff from between his feet, Until Shiloh [the Messiah, the Peaceful One] comes, And to Him shall be the obedience of the peoples. Genesis 49:10*

1. SHILOH AS A PERSON - Shiloh points prophetically to Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace.

- Isaiah 9:6
- John 1:14, 49 / 14:27
- Ephesians 2:14
- Shiloh means peace, rest, and fulfillment.

2. SHILOH AS A PLACE - Shiloh became the dwelling place of God’s presence and worship for Israel.

- Joshua 15:63 / 18:1, 8–10
- 1 Samuel 1:9–11 / 2:6–8
- 2 Samuel 5:6–9
- 1 Chronicles 28:2–3
- The tabernacle was established at Shiloh.
- Hannah prayed at Shiloh and received her miracle.

3. SHILOH AS A GATEWAY - Shiloh represents access to God.

- 1 Samuel 1:9
- John 10:9 - Jesus declared, *“I am the Door.”*
- Deuteronomy 6:9
- Jesus is the only gateway to eternal life and fellowship with God.

4. THE FALL OF SHILOH - Disobedience and corruption caused Shiloh’s downfall.

- Psalm 78:60
- 1 Samuel 2:12, 32–33
- Jeremiah 7:1–15 / 26:6
- Israel neglected holiness and obedience.
- The sons of Eli corrupted the priesthood.
- God departed from Shiloh because of sin.
- God desires obedience and holiness more than empty religion.

5. BE FAITHFUL - God calls believers to remain faithful to His Word and Kingdom.

- 1 Corinthians 4:2
- Titus 1:9
- Jude 1:3
- Matthew 6:33
- Seek ye first the Kingdom of God.
