A STUDY OF PSALM 75 (PT 2)

For in the hand of the Lord there is a cup, and the wine is red; it is full of mixture; and he poureth out of the same: but the dregs thereof, all the wicked of the earth shall wring them out, and drink them.

Key Scripture: Psalm 75:8

I. THREE KEY METAPHORS in Psalm 75

1. The Foolish and the Wicked - Psalm 75:4

• Fools and the wicked are warned; God's judgment is assured.

2. The Horn: Power of the Wicked and the Righteous - Psalm 75:4, 10

- Horn symbolizes strength or authority.
- Psalm 18:2
- Zechariah 12:2 A cup of trembling context of judgment and conflict.
- Psalm 75:10 God cuts off the horn of the wicked but exalts the horn of the righteous.

3. The Cup: God's Fury and Blessing -

 Psalm 75:8 - The "cup" symbolizes God's wrath and the wine mixed with spices signifies the potent and intense nature of this judgment, which will be fully experienced by the wicked.

II. THE CUP IN SCRIPTURE: 6 THEMES

1. The Cup of Wrath – Judgment

Psalm 75:8; Isaiah 51:17, 22; Jeremiah 25:15 / 51:7 - Bitter, intoxicating, symbolic of divine anger poured upon nations or individuals.

2. The Cup of Suffering – Substitution

- John 18:11; Matthew 26:39; Isaiah 51:17
 -Jesus drinks this cup on behalf of mankind—suffering for our sins.
- 1 Peter 2:24; 2 Corinthians 5:21 Christ bears our sin.

3. The Cup of Salvation – Deliverance

• Psalm 116:13, 5 - Expresses gratitude for God's deliverance.

4. The Cup of Communion – Fellowship

- 1 Corinthians 11:23-26; Luke 22:20
- Symbol of the New Covenant in Jesus' blood. Represents spiritual union with Christ through His sacrifice.

5. The Cup of Demons – False Worship

- 1 Corinthians 10:21 "You cannot drink the cup of the Lord and the cup of demons."
- Jeremiah 35:6 Warning against participation in idolatrous practices.

6. The Cup of Blessing – Abundance & Grace

• 1 Corinthians 10:16; Psalm 23:5 - Symbol of overflowing grace, joy, and provision.
